1 AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE concerning: Personnel – Classified Service

3 FOR the purpose of modifying minimum qualifications for certain classifications in the
4 classified service and generally relating to personnel.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments: §§ 6-1-201(d)(1)
7 Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended)

9 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County,*
10 *Maryland,* That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as
11 follows:

13 ARTICLE 6 PERSONNEL

15 TITLE 1. CLASSIFIED SERVICE

17 **6-1-201. Titles; pay grades; work weeks; minimum qualifications.**

18
19 (d) **Title, pay grades, work week, and minimum qualifications.** The title, minimum
20 standards, pay grade, and the work week designation that an employee is required to
21 follow for each class within the classified service are as follows:

23 (1) Accounting, Auditing, and Budgeting (AC).).

Title	Grade and Work Week	Minimum Qualifications
Assistant County Auditor	NR23C	Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with major course work in accounting or finance; extensive experience in governmental or public accounting and auditing; [thorough experience in public program analysis;] and certification as a public accountant in the State
Legislative Audit Manager	NR21C	Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with major course work in accounting or finance; extensive experience in governmental or public accounting and auditing; [thorough experience in public program analysis;] and certification as a public accountant in the State
Legislative Auditor I	NR16C	Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with major course work in accounting or finance; and some experience in governmental or public accounting and auditing
Legislative Auditor II	NR18C	Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with major course work in accounting or finance; AND considerable experience in governmental or public accounting and auditing[; and some experience in public program analysis]
Legislative Auditor III	NR20C	Graduation from an accredited four-year college or university with major course work in accounting or finance; thorough experience in governmental or public accounting and auditing; [considerable experience in public program analysis;] and certification as a public accountant in the State

2 SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be
3 an emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
4 peace, health, safety, welfare, and property and being passed by the affirmative vote of
5 five members of the County Council, the same shall take effect from the date it becomes
6 law.
