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A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning: Finance, Taxation, and Budget – Property Tax Payment  
2 Deferral for Elderly or Disabled Homeowners

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4 FOR the purpose of increasing the ceiling on gross income for eligibility for the real  
5 property tax payment deferral applicable to certain elderly or disabled homeowners;  
6 providing for the applicability of this Ordinance; and generally relating to the real  
7 property tax payment deferral for certain elderly or disabled homeowners.

9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments: § 4-2-203(c)  
10 Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended)

12 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County,*  
13 *Maryland,* That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as  
14 follows:

16 **ARTICLE 4 FINANCE, TAXATION, AND BUDGET**  
17 **TITLE 2. REAL PROPERTY TAXES**

19 **4-2-203. Deferral for elderly or disabled homeowners.**

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21 (c) **Ceiling on gross income.** Homeowners are eligible if their combined gross  
22 income, as defined in the Tax-Property Article, § 9-104, of the State Code, does not  
23 exceed [\$30,000] \$50,000 per year.

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EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate new matter added to existing law.  
[Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.

1       SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Ordinance shall not apply to an  
2 Agreement under § 4-2-203(j) of the County Code (2005, as amended) that was executed  
3 before the effective date of this Ordinance.

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5       SECTION 3. *And be it further enacted*, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days  
6 from the date it becomes law.
