A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning: Personnel – Positions in the Classified Service

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3 FOR the purpose of adding a new classification, grade and minimum qualifications for a
4 certain classification in the classified service; deleting a classification, grade and
5 minimum qualifications for a certain classification in the classified service; providing
6 for the applicability of this Ordinance; and generally relating to personnel.

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8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments: § 6-1-201(d)(4)

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11 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County,*
12 *Maryland,* That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as
13 follows:

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15 **ARTICLE 6 PERSONNEL**
16 **TITLE 1. CLASSIFIED SERVICE**

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18 **6-1-201. Titles; pay grades; work weeks; minimum qualifications.**

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20 (d) **Title, pay grades, work week, and minimum qualifications.** The title, minimum
21 standards, pay grade, and the work week designation that an employee is required to
22 follow for each class within the classified service are as follows:

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(4) Facilities, Trades, Equipment, and Maintenance (FT).

Title	Grade and Work Week	Minimum Qualifications

Facilities Maintenance Mechanic II	LM9B	Graduation from high school or vocational school; experience at the journeyman level in one or more of the building and mechanical trades; and a valid non-commercial Class C motor vehicle operator's license
FACILITIES MAINTENANCE MECHANIC III	LM11B	GRADUATION FROM HIGH SCHOOL OR VOCATIONAL SCHOOL; STATE LICENSE OR INTERNATIONAL CODE COUNCIL CERTIFICATION IN ONE OR MORE OF THE BUILDING TRADES; EXPERIENCE AS A FACILITIES MAINTENANCE MECHANIC II; CONSIDERABLE KNOWLEDGE OF ENERGY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM PROGRAMS; AND A VALID NON-COMMERCIAL CLASS C MOTOR VEHICLE OPERATOR'S LICENSE

[Senior Facilities Maintenance Mechanic	LM12B	Graduation from high school or vocational school; State license or International Code Council certification in one or more of the building trades; considerable experience at the journey level in one or more of the building and mechanical trades; considerable knowledge of energy management system programs; and a valid non-commercial Class C motor vehicle operator's license]

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SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted,* That the repeal, amendment, or addition of any classifications under this Ordinance shall take effect at the beginning of the first full bi-weekly pay period on or after the effective date provided in Section 3 of this Ordinance. The repeal of any classifications under this Ordinance shall only occur when such classifications are reclassified to existing classifications or to new classifications created by this Ordinance, it being the intent of the County Council that no position in the classified service shall be abolished as a result of this Ordinance, but that all positions in classifications repealed by this Ordinance shall be reclassified to existing classifications or to new classifications created by the Ordinance.

SECTION 3. *And be it further enacted,* That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.
