1 RESOLUTION approving the application to the Maryland Department of Health and  
2 Mental Hygiene for a grant under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (“ARRA”)  
3 Immunization Activities grant program and recognizing the County Executive’s authority to  
4 act in connection with the grant

6 WHEREAS, the County Health Department has prepared an application for a grant  
7 under the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene’s American  
8 Recovery and Reinvestment Act (“ARRA”) Immunization Activities grant program,  
9 seeking a grant in the amount of \$33,100 (the “Application”); and

11 WHEREAS, under the Application, the County is required to provide \$0 in matching  
12 funds; and

14 WHEREAS, the Health Department is the agency that will administer the  
15 expenditure of the grant and any matching funds; and

17 WHEREAS, the County Executive has requested that the County Council approve  
18 the Application; and

20 WHEREAS, Section 306 of the Anne Arundel County Charter provides that the  
21 County Council shall have the power to accept gifts and grants; now, therefore be it

23 *Resolved by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,* That it approves  
24 the application to the Maryland Department of Health and Mental Hygiene for a grant under  
25 the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (“ARRA”) Immunization Activities grant  
26 program in the amount of \$33,100 with \$0 matching funds, which grant is to be administered  
27 by Health Department; and be it further

29 *Resolved,* That the County Council recognizes that the County Executive or the County  
30 Executive’s designee is duly authorized to act in connection with the grant; and be it further
