A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ORDINANCE concerning: Public Ethics – Secondary Employment

2
3 FOR the purpose of amending certain conflict of interest provisions concerning
4 secondary employment of police officers; and generally related to ethics.

6 BY repealing and reenacting with amendments: § 7-5-102(b)(5)
7 (Anne Arundel County Code, 2005, as amended)

9 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,*
10 That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:

12 **ARTICLE 7. PUBLIC ETHICS**

14 **TITLE 5. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST**

16 **7-5-102. Employment or financial interests; general restriction.**

17
18 (b) **Exceptions.** The prohibitions of subsection (a) do not apply:

19
20 (5) to secondary employment by a County police officer in an establishment OR
21 IN THE PARKING AREA OF AN ESTABLISHMENT where liquor is sold or served, provided
22 that the secondary employment:

24 (i) does not take place [in] INSIDE OF a tavern OR A BUSINESS THAT OFFERS
25 AS ITS PRIMARY SERVICE THE SALE OR DISPENSING OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES;

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate new matter added to existing law.
[Brackets] indicate matter stricken from existing law.

1 (ii) is not performed [for a business that offers as its primary service the sale
2 or dispensing of alcoholic beverages] WITHIN AN OUTDOOR SERVING AREA OF AN
3 ESTABLISHMENT LICENSED TO SELL OR DISPENSE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES; and

5 (iii) does not include the duty under that secondary employment to sell, serve,
6 or handle alcoholic beverages, check identification or otherwise screen patrons for
7 admission to the establishment, or remove intoxicated or unruly patrons from the
8 establishment; or

10 SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days
11 after it becomes law.
