A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE concerning: Personal Property Tax Credits – Foreign
2 Trade Zones

4 FOR the purpose of extending the termination date established by Bill No. 87-01 of a certain
5 personal property tax credit, and making this Ordinance an emergency measure.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments: Bill No. 87-01, Section 2
8 Laws of Anne Arundel County 2001

10 WHEREAS, Bill No. 87-01, now codified as § 4-3-101 of the Anne Arundel County
11 Code (2005, as amended), provides that the personal property tax credit created by
12 Bill No. 87-01 shall end on June 30, 2007; and

14 WHEREAS, the personal property tax credit for personal property located in a
15 foreign trade zone has been beneficial for the public peace, health, safety, welfare,
16 and property, of the Anne Arundel County; and

18 WHEREAS, the County Executive has requested that the County Council continue
19 this personal property tax credit; now therefore

20
21 SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,*
22 That Bill No. 87-01, Section 2, Laws of Anne Arundel County, 2001 read as follows:

24 SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Ordinance shall be effective
25 [for no longer than five tax years] commencing with the tax year that begins on
26 July 1, 2002 and, on June 30, [2007] 2012, with no further action required by the

1 County Council, this Ordinance shall be abrogated and of no further force and
2 effect.

4 SECTION 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an
5 emergency ordinance and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace,
6 health, safety, welfare, and property, and being passed by the affirmative vote of five
7 members of the County Council, the same shall take effect from the date it becomes law.
