WESTERN DISTRICT

CDS ARREST

HANOVER

On April 4, 2008 Western District Officers responded to the Shell gas station, located at 2753 Annapolis Road, Hanover MD, for a report of a subject asleep in a vehicle that was still running. Upon arriving, officers discovered a black male subject sleeping behind the wheel of 1999 Ford Explorer SUV, while the vehicle was still running. It took several minutes to wake the subject. The subject appeared to be under the influence and there was a beer can within the passenger compartment of the vehicle. Officers arrested the subject and searched his person. During the search four (4) .38 caliber handgun rounds were found in the suspect's pants pocket. Through further investigation officers found a bag within the vehicle, which contained a .38 caliber revolver. Along with the revolver officers found a plastic baggie of suspected powder cocaine having a weight of 28 grams and a street value of \$2800 dollars. Also found in the bag were several scales and other paraphernalia which indicated the subjects intent to distribute the cocaine. The subject was charged with various traffic charges, and CDS and weapons offenses. The suspect had US currency in his possession that was seized as drug gains.

ARMED ROBBERY

On 4-4-08 at 1655hrs officers from Northern District responded to 7237 Ritchie Highway in Glen Burnie, Maryland for an Armed Robbery of the Citgo Gas Station. The suspect entered the store, displayed a silver and black handgun, and demanded money. The suspect took an unknown amount of U.S currency. The suspect fled on foot towards the Pep Boys parking lot located at 7311 Ritchie Hwy. Northern District officers, Howard County Air and K-9, canvassed the surrounding area; all ending in negative results.

DROWNING

On 04/05/08 at approximately 0818 hours the Anne Arundel County Police Department responded to the area of 966 Nabbs Creek Rd in Glen Burnie, Maryland for a suspected drowning.

Upon arrival officers located the victim, later identified as **Joseph John Akczinski Jr. (White male, DOB 1-11-50)** of 864 Nabbs Creek Rd in Glen Burnie, Maryland, floating face down in Nabbs Creek approximately 120 yards off shore. Maryland Natural Resource Police assisted with the recovery. **Mr. Akczinski** was reported missing on 3/15/08. There were no signs of trauma. The cause of death is undetermined pending the results of the Medical Examiner's Office examination. Notification was made to Mr. Akczinski's Sister.

NORTHERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On April 5th 2008 officers from the Northern District responded to 7840 Levy Court for a report of a robbery that just occurred. Upon arriving officers spoke with the victim who is a pizza delivery driver. He reported that after making a delivery to 7840 Levy Court, Glen Burnie he was returning to his car when 2 black males confronted him. One black male put his hand into his jumpsuit and pointed to the driver as if he was armed and demanded the pizza

delivery driver's delivery money. As the driver pulled out his delivery money from his pocket he also pulled out his personal money and his cell phone and gave it to the black male. As he did the black male observed the deliveryman's watch and demanded that as well. The suspects took an undetermined amount of money; a cell phone and a watch then fled the area.

A canvass of the area was completed for the suspects with negative results.

EASTERN DISTRICT

DS ARREST

GLEN BURNIE

On April 5, 2008, at approximately 2356 hours, Officer L. Facciponti of the Anne Arundel County Police Department, Platoon #4 Eastern District, was on patrol when he stopped a vehicle, a Ford Taurus, for a safety equipment violation on Elvaton Road near Hospital Drive in Glen Burnie.

A routine check of the driver revealed he had no license and was wanted on two outstanding warrants. The driver was arrested and a search of the vehicle incident to arrest was conducted.

The vehicle search revealed 8.8 grams of suspected marihuana, 56.5 grams of suspected powder cocaine and 191.7 grams of suspected crack cocaine with approximate street values of \$132.00, \$11,300.00 and \$38,340.00 respectively. A digital scale was also found in the vehicle. The vehicle passenger was subsequently arrested.

The driver was identified as Charles Pearmon (43) of the 300 block of Forest Beach Road in Annapolis and the passenger was identified as Kirk Porter (28) of the 300 block of Magothy Beach Road in Pasadena.

Both were charged with possession of marihuana, possession of CDS not marihuana, possession with intent to distribute CDS, possession with intent to distribute a narcotic, possession of CDS narcotics with intent to distribute large amounts, and possession of CDS paraphernalia. The driver was given a repair order for the safety equipment violation and was additionally charged with driving without a license.

The 1996 Ford Taurus and \$216.00 in U.S. Currency were seized under asset seizure guidelines.

WESTERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

ODENTON

On April 6, 2008 Western District Officers responded to the area of Seven Oaks Shopping Center, located at 2288 Bluewater Blvd., Odenton MD, in reference to a robbery of a citizen.

The robbery occurred when two juvenile males pointed a handgun and demanded U.S. Currency from a juvenile. The first suspect was described as: a black male, with a mustache, with a hairstyle of dreadlocks, having a thin build, being approximately 16-17 years of age. He was last seen wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans. The second suspect was described as: a black male, with a hairstyle of dreadlocks, having a thin build, being approximately 16-17 years of age. He was last seen wearing a black and blue sweatshirt and blue jeans. The victim was not injured and was able to return to his residence and contact the police. The suspects fled with the victim's personal items in a white vehicle with unknown registration.

Officers responded to the scene to canvass the area for the suspects, but had negative results.

SOUTHERN DISTRICT

COUNTERFEIT CURRENCY ARREST

ANNAPOLIS

On April 4th 2008 at 1900 hours officers working secondary employment at the Westfield Shopping center in Annapolis were directed to the Chick-Fila business for a report of a male subject attempting to pass counterfeit currency. Officers spoke with the manager of the business who reported that a white male of possible Italian descent attempted to purchase a drink utilizing a counterfeit fifty-dollar bill. Employees immediately recognized that the currency was fraudulent and declined the purchase. After the subject left the business the employees contacted mall security and the police. Officers working secondary employment at the mall with the assistance of the mall's security force attempted to locate the subject.

During that time a second mall merchant who is an employee of the Boarders bookstore also located in the shopping center approached Sgt. John Gilmer who was also working secondary employment at the mall. The merchant reported that a male subject with the same description attempted to make a purchase utilizing a counterfeit fifty-dollar-bill. The merchant reported that the incident happened with-in the last thirty seconds and that the subject was last seen walking north in the mall from the Boarders business. Sgt. Gilmer and mall security officers immediately converged on the area and were able to quickly locate the subject fitting the description. The subject was detained and questioned about his recent whereabouts. During the investigation the subject was found to be in possession of 15 counterfeit fifty-dollar-bills in addition to \$240 dollars in legitimate currency.

At one point while detained the subject attempted to flee from officers but was quickly apprehended behind a business in the 100 block of Defense Hwy. After the foot pursuit the subject complained of chest pains and problems breathing. Because of his complaints he was transported to Anne Arundel Medical Center by ambulance. The United States Secret Service Baltimore field office was contacted and a special agent responded to Southern District to assist with the case. The subject was charged with the following state charges:

1. Two counts of knowingly passing counterfeit documents.
 2. One count of possessing counterfeit currency
 3. One count of resisting arrest.

It is unknown at this time whether the subject will also face federal charges.
