**Synopsis:**

On June 17, 2009, at approximately 8:34 a.m., members of the Traffic Safety Section were requested to respond to the area of Solomon's Island Road and Polling House Road in Harwood to assist with a serious, personal injury, motor vehicle crash.

Preliminary investigation suggests that the driver of vehicle #1 was operating a 1999 Toyota Camry that was traveling northbound on Solomon's Island Road approaching Polling House Road. For unknown reasons, the Toyota drifted from the northbound lane across the double yellow line into the southbound lane of Solomon's Island Road directly into the path of vehicle #2 (2006 Chevrolet Van). The van was unable to avoid the oncoming Toyota and subsequently struck the Toyota head on. As a result of the collision, the driver of vehicle #1, Rebecca Crocker, suffered multiple upper and lower body injuries and is in critical condition at University of Maryland Shock Trauma. Speed and alcohol are not believed to be factors in the crash. The investigation is still ongoing.

**ROBBERY/ASSAULT ARREST**

**GLEN BURNIE**

On June 17, 2009, at approximately 2:26 p.m., officers from Eastern District responded to the 600 block of Mayo Road in Glen Burnie for a report of a fight.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the male victim, who advised that had been assaulted and robbed after he returned home from the store. As the victim exited his vehicle, a male subject approached him, presented a knife and demanded money. At the same time, a second male subject approached the victim and forcibly removed an undetermined amount of U. S. currency from his pocket.

The victim, fearing for his life, began to struggle with the two suspects. The victim was assisted by four witnesses that observed the altercation and the witnesses were able to scare the suspects off. One suspect was arrested a short time later by police just a few blocks from the robbery scene, but the other suspect still remains at large. The victim suffered cuts and scrapes during the incident and was treated and released from Baltimore Washington Medical Center.
