**NORTHERN DISTRICT DETECTIVES IDENTIFY TWO SUSPECTS IN
RECENT STABBING**

STABBING/ASSAULT UPDATE

BROOKLYN PARK

On June 13, 2009, at approximately 10:30 pm, officers from Northern District responded to the 10th Avenue Park located in the 300 block of 10th Avenue in Brooklyn Park for a report of a stabbing and assault that had just occurred.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with three male victims from Columbia, Maryland and several witnesses, who stated that a large fight erupted at the conclusion of a soccer game they were watching. During the fight, the three victims were stabbed by several suspects and subsequently transported to University of Maryland Shock Trauma for their injuries. The three victims were subsequently released the following day.

As a result of this incident, investigators from the Northern District Detective Unit conducted the follow-up investigation. During the subsequent investigation, Northern District Detectives identified two suspects directly involved in the stabbing of the victims. The suspects were identified and charged on arrest warrants, but remain at large at this time.

Suspect #1: Jesus Macias Salazar, 41, of the 7900 block of Lansdale Road, Baltimore, MD. He is being charged with 1st Degree Assault, 2nd Degree Assault, Reckless Endangerment, Possession of a Deadly Weapon With Intent to Injure and Possession of a Concealed Deadly Weapon

Suspect #2: Juan Martinez Hernandez, 23, of the 7900 block of Lansdale Road, Baltimore, MD. He is being charged with Attempted 2nd Degree Murder, 1st Degree Assault, 2nd Degree Assault, Reckless Endangerment, Possession of a Deadly Weapon With Intent to Injure and Possession of a Concealed Deadly Weapon

Suspect #3: Hispanic male, approximately 20-30 years old

Suspect #4: Hispanic male, approximately 20-30 years old

EASTERN DISTRICT

HIT & RUN/DWI ARREST

GLEN BURNIE

On June 18, 2009, at approximately 5:05 p.m., officers from Eastern District responded to a report of a property damage hit and run accident on Maryland Route 100 (eastbound) near I-97 in the Glen Burnie area.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with witnesses, who advised that a Toyota Camry had been driving erratically, sideswiped another vehicle and fled the scene. Officers set up surveillance in the area and located the suspect vehicle travelling eastbound on Route 100 near Ritchie Highway. An officer attempted to stop the vehicle, but the operator refused to stop and continued to weave onto the shoulder or into the roadside grass. Officers followed the vehicle east on Route 100, where the operator took the exit for Route 10 south. The operator eventually crashed the vehicle into the curb at the intersection of Route 10 and Ritchie Highway. The operator of the vehicle was not injured and was arrested at that location.

Suspect: Gerald L. Whoolery, Jr., 42, of the 7200 block of Park Circle Drive #252, Hanover, MD. He was charged with DWI, Failing To Stop After An Accident, Fleeing and Eluding, Negligent and Reckless Driving.

SOUTHERN DISTRICT

DESTRUCTION TO PROPERTY

LOTHIAN

On June 17, 2009, at approximately 11:55 p.m., officers from Southern District to the area of Mount Zion Marlboro Road near Boones Drive in Lothian for a report of destruction to a vehicle.

Upon arrival, officers spoke to witnesses, who stated that a Freightliner Tractor was traveling westbound on Mount Zion Marlboro Road near Boones Drive when something was thrown at the driver side door of the vehicle from another vehicle. In addition to this incident, on June 18, 2009, and on June 19, 2009, officers from Southern District responded to two separate complaints of destruction of property, where rocks were thrown from a passing car at another car.

One victim advised that on June 18th at approximately 11:30 p.m., she was traveling westbound on Mount Zion Marlboro Road just past Route 2 when a car traveling eastbound threw

a large rock at her car. The rock struck her windshield and shattered the glass and the rock came to rest on her dashboard after striking her windshield. The victim was not injured in the incident.

Two victims advised that on June 18th at approximately 11:35 p.m., they were traveling westbound on route 258 near Route 4 when a large rock was thrown from a passing car that was going the opposite direction. The rock struck their front bumper and caused significant damage to the bumper. The suspect car was described as an older, dark-colored, four-door model. The victims in this incident were not injured. It is believed that these incidents are all related.
