WESTERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

ODENTON

On June 24, 2009, at approximately 10:15 p.m., officers from Western District responded to the 1400 block of Berger Street in Odenton for a reported robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, a 28-year-old male pizza delivery driver, who advised that he had just attempted to deliver a pizza to a residence on the aforementioned street. When he arrived, he observed three male subjects standing in front of the residence. After he delivered the pizza, one suspect grabbed money from the victim's hand and punched him in the face. The suspects then chased the victim back to his vehicle and eventually fled the area on foot with stolen pizza and an undetermined amount of U.S. currency. Several officers, a K-9 unit and an Aviation unit searched the area, but were unable to locate the suspects. The victim sustained a minor injury that did not require medical treatment.

Suspect #1: Black male, 5'7", 150-160 lbs, 16-18 years of age with no shirt

Suspect #2: Black male, 5'5", 16-18 years of age, black hooded sweatshirt and jeans

Suspect #3: Black male, 16-18 years of age

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

SEVERN

On June 25, 2009, at approximately 3:16 a.m., officers from the Western District responded to the 7-11 convenience store located in the 500 block of Donaldson Road in Severn for a silent alarm.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the store clerk, who reported that two subjects entered the store; one displayed an apparent handgun and demanded money while the other held open the

front door. The clerk did not comply with the demands and activated the silent alarm. At this juncture, the suspect shot the clerk in the neck with a BB gun (handgun replica). Both suspects ran from the store in an unknown direction. Numerous officers and a K-9 unit canvassed the area, but could not locate the suspects.

Suspect #1 Black male, approximately 5'10", 140lbs, wearing a dark-colored, short sleeve jersey with white stripes on the sleeves and the #05 printed on back, black shorts, white tennis shoes, black mask and black gloves

Suspect #2 Black male, approximately 5'10", 140lbs, wearing a dark and white-striped, long sleeve shirt, blue jean shorts, dark-colored shoes and a black mask

Synopsis:

On June 24, 2009 at approximately 11:19 p.m., a Ford F250 was traveling northbound on Route 10 north of Ritchie Highway when the operator lost control of the vehicle. The vehicle struck guardrails on both sides of the highway. This impact caused the vehicle to flip up on top of the barrier wall of the overpass to eastbound Route 100. The vehicle then slid along top of the barrier wall for more than 100 feet, eventually fell off the barrier and off the overpass to the roadside adjacent to eastbound Route 100.

The driver of the vehicle was pronounced dead at the scene from the injuries he sustained in the collision. At this time, it is unknown if the driver was under the influence of drugs or alcohol when this collision occurred. It is believed that excessive speed was a contributing factor to the cause of this collision.

NORTHERN DISTRICT

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

PUMPHREY

On June 25, 2009, at approximately 6:08 a.m., officers from the Northern District responded to St. Agnes Hospital for the report of an attempted robbery and stabbing that occurred earlier in the 5500 block of Belle Grove Road in Pumphrey.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, a 47 year-old male from Glen Burnie, who stated that he was preparing to go fishing when he was approached by two male subjects. The subjects asked for a cigarette and money and the victim advised that he did not have any cigarettes or money. Consequently, one of the suspects produced a knife and a struggle with the victim ensued. The victim fell during the altercation and was subsequently stabbed in the leg multiple times by the suspect. Both suspects fled the area on foot. The victim was treated for minor injuries at St. Agnes Hospital and later released. Numerous officers canvassed the vicinity, but were unable to locate the suspects.

Suspect#1: White male in his early 20's, wearing white t-shirt, blue jeans and white sneakers.

Suspect#2: White male in his early 20's, wearing a red shirt and blue jeans.

DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY ARRESTS

On June 19, 2009, at approximately 6:00 a.m., officers from the Northern District responded to North County High School located in the first block of 1st Avenue East in Glen Burnie for a destruction of property complaint.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with school officials, who advised that lights in several buildings sustained property damage along with a vehicle located on school grounds. Though investigation, detectives identified four people responsible for the destruction of property. The four suspects have all been charged with Destruction of Property Over \$500.00, Trespassing on School Property and Trespassing/ Damaging School Property.
