**ACCIDENTAL DEATH**

**ANNAPOLIS**

On June 25, 2009, at approximately 5:38 p.m., officers from the Eastern District responded to the 1500 block of Stacey Lane in Annapolis for a report of an accidental drowning.

Upon arrival, officers located a 3-year-old female victim, who had fallen into an in-ground swimming pool at the residence. Family members were attending to the victim and officers immediately initiated CPR on the child. The paramedics arrived a short time after and attended to the victim, who was transported to Anne Arundel County Medical Center, where she was pronounced dead upon arrival.

**Synopsis:**

On June 25, 2009, at approximately 7:44 p.m., vehicle #1 was traveling east on Defense Highway (Md. 450) when it crossed over the centerline into the westbound lane. Vehicle #2, which was traveling westbound, was struck head-on by vehicle #1. The driver of vehicle #2 was pronounced dead at the scene; and the driver of vehicle #1 sustained serious injuries and was transported to Shock Trauma for treatment.

Currently, there is no evidence to suggest that drug or alcohol usage contributed to this collision. The initial investigation does suggest that vehicle #1 was exceeding the posted speed limit. Any charges will be placed after the investigation is completed and reviewed by the State Attorney's Office.
