FATAL MOTOR VEHICLE COLLISION

DEALE

Synopsis:

On June 27, 2009, at approximately 8:38 p.m., officers from the Southern District were dispatched to the 5400 block of Deale Churchton Road in Deale for a report of a motor vehicle crash. Due to severity of the injuries, crash investigators from the Traffic Safety Section were dispatched to the scene and assumed responsibility for the investigation.

The initial investigation revealed that a 1985 Honda Shadow motorcycle was traveling eastbound on Deale Churchton Road just west of Offer Lane when the motorcycle failed to negotiate a curve in the roadway, crossed the centerline and struck a 2007 Chevrolet Cobalt that was traveling in the westbound lane. The impact caused the operator of the motorcycle to be separated from the vehicle.

The driver of the motorcycle sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced dead at the scene by Anne Arundel County Paramedic 2. The driver of the Cobalt complained of minor injuries, but refused to be transported to the hospital. The initial investigation indicated that excessive speed and alcohol may have been factors in this crash. The operator of the motorcycle was wearing a D.O.T. approved helmet at the time of the crash.

EASTERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On June 27, 2009, at approximately 9:20 a.m., officers from the Eastern District responded to the Baltimore Washington Federal Credit Union located in the 300 block of Hospital Drive in Glen Burnie for a reported robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with bank employees, who stated that two male subjects entered the bank; and one of the subjects approached the teller displaying a black handgun. Next, the suspect pointed the handgun at the teller and demanded all her money. The other suspect stood nearby with a backpack to put the money in. The teller complied with the demands and the suspects exited the bank with an undetermined amount of U.S. currency. The suspects then fled the area on foot. Numerous officers and a K-9 unit with assistance from a Howard County Aviation unit searched the area, but could not locate the suspects.

Suspect#1: Black male in his mid to late teens, wearing a gray, hooded sweatshirt, black balaclava, black backpack, black pants and black and white sneakers.

Suspect#2: Black male in his mid to late teens, wearing a gray, hooded sweatshirt, white object over his face, black shorts and sneakers. (armed with a handgun)

NORTHERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On June 29, 2009, at approximately 12:42 a.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the 6900 block of Glen Ridge Circle in Glen Burnie for a reported robbery of a citizen.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the 28-year-old male victim from Glen Burnie, who stated that he was just robbed by two male subjects. He advised that suspects approached him with a handgun, struck him in the face with the handgun and stole the victim's cell phone and money. The suspects then fled on foot. The victim suffered two lacerations to his face, but refused medical treatment. Several officers and a K-9 unit canvassed the area, but were unable to locate the suspects.

Suspect#1: Black male, approximately 20 years old, last seen wearing a black shirt with stripes and black pants. (armed with a handgun)

Suspect#2: Black male, approximately 20 years old, last seen wearing black clothing and a black face mask.

ROBBERY ARREST

GLEN BURNIE

On June 27, 2009, at approximately 8:33 p.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the Keystone Fireworks stand located in the 6600 block of Ritchie Highway in Glen Burnie for a report of an armed robbery that just occurred.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the employee, who stated that a male subject approached the fireworks stand, browsed at merchandise and picked up several items from the display. A few moments later, the suspect brandished a pocket knife and displayed it to the employee. After observing the knife and fearing for safety, the employee told the suspect to take the merchandise and the suspect subsequently walked away from the tent with the merchandise and headed towards E. Ordnance Road. Officers searched the area, yet could not initially locate the suspect. A short time later, while interviewing the employee, the suspect returned to the scene and the employee immediately identified the suspect as the person who had committed the robbery earlier. Consequently, officers placed the suspect under arrest without incident. He was charged with Armed Robbery, Robbery, 1st Degree Assault, 2nd Degree Assault, Possession of a Deadly Weapon and Theft under \$100.

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On June 27, 2009, at approximately 12:18 a.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the Papa Johns Pizza located in the 800 block of Crain Hwy S. in Glen Burnie for a report of a robbery that just occurred.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, a delivery driver, who advised that she was walking to the front door of the business when she was approached her from behind by two male subjects. The suspects ordered the victim to hand over money. The victim felt an object placed on her back and acquiesced with the demands of the suspects by handing them an undisclosed amount of U.S. currency. The suspects were last observed running west towards Corkran Middle School. Numerous officers, a K-9 unit and Aviation unit searched the vicinity, but could not locate the suspects.

Suspect#1: Black male, approximately 5'8", wearing a dark shirt and white shorts.

Suspect#2: Black male, approximately 5'10", wearing a dark shirt and baggy blue jeans.

CDS ARREST

On June 26, 2009, at approximately 8:55 a.m., officers from Western District responded to the Motel 6 located in the 3500 block of Old Annapolis Road in Laurel for suspicious subjects in the area.

Upon arrival, officers encountered two suspects who were attempting to bury a package in the ground. The suspects fled on foot after spotting police. Both suspects were eventually taken into custody. One of the suspects was found to be in possession of a digital scale with a white, powder residue on it. Additionally, the package the suspects were attempting to bury turned out to be approximately 15 grams of crack cocaine with an estimated street value of \$1500.00. Both subjects were charged with two counts of Trespassing, Possession of CDS Paraphernalia, Possession of CDS Not Marijuana, Possession With Intent To Distribute and Resisting Arrest.

ODENTON

On June 26, 2009, at approximately 9:13 p.m., officers from the Western District responded to the 2600 block of Rainy Spring Court in Odenton for a report of an assault.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the male victim, who stated that he was walking in the area of Bragg Boulevard and Falling Brook Court when he was approached by several male subjects. One suspect punched the victim in the mouth while the others kicked him and took his wallet and bag he was carrying. The suspects fled in an unknown direction. Numerous officers searched the area, but could not locate the suspects. The victim sustained minor injuries in the incident.

Suspect #1: Black male, 16-18 years old, approximately 5'7", bald with a thin build, last seen wearing glasses, a black t-shirt and blue jeans.
