Northern District

Drug Possession

On March 3, 2008, Detectives from the Anne Arundel County Police Department's Special Enforcement Section along with the Northern District Tactical Patrol Unit (TPU) conducted an interdiction traffic stop as part of an ongoing drug investigation. Detectives received information that William Charles Hill Jr. had been traveling from Baltimore County to Anne Arundel County to deal drugs. Detectives were in the area of 695 and Route 10 when they observed a 1994 Gold Honda that Hill is known to use when selling drugs.

A moving violation was observed and TPU Detectives initiated a traffic stop. Detectives made contact with Mr. Hill and a drug detection canine performed a scan of the vehicle. The dog gave a positive "alert" for the presence of CDS. Approximately 444 grams of suspected marihuana was located in a grocery bag inside the passenger compartment of the vehicle.

Mr. Hill was arrested and transported to Northern District. \$100 of U.S. Currency was seized from Hill and forfeiture proceedings initiated. The Honda was also seized and transported to the Anne Arundel County Police Impound Lot. The estimated street value of the marihuana seized was over \$8,000.

Special Enforcement Section

In January 2008, the Anne Arundel County Vice Unit received complaints from concerned citizens residing in the Russett Green Community, Laurel that over several months they have observed various males and females entering and leaving the residence of 3403 Holly Creek Drive, Laurel, Maryland 20724, at all times of the day. Residents suspected that criminal activity was occurring inside. Over the next month, detectives conducted hours of surveillance of the residence, noticing a variety of people entering & leaving the apartment at various times throughout the course of the day.

From this surveillance, detectives were able to identify several females. Investigation revealed that the women were advertising sexual services from various websites and scheduling appointments at this residence. Undercover detectives then contacted one of the females through her website and scheduled an appointment. During the appointment on February 28, 2008, a solicitation for sexual acts was received and a search & seizure warrant was executed.

As a result of this investigation the following female was determined to be managing this sexual enterprise operating out of the residence at 3403 Holly Creek Drive. She was arrested and charged accordingly:
