ROBBERY

SEVERN

On Sunday, March 23rd, 2008, at about 1:39 a.m., officers responded to Still Meadows Drive and Durness Court in Severn for a citizens report of a robbery in progress. Among the first arriving units to the scene was a K-9 unit. The first arriving units were confronted with a vehicle speeding toward them fleeing from the area. The fleeing vehicle struck the K-9 car, and then drove across the street into a nearby court. As the vehicle was moving up the court, two subjects jumped out of the vehicle and fled on foot. The suspect's vehicle continued traveling forward, stopping after striking a parked car. The K-9 officer and his partner pursued the robbery suspects on foot. The K-9 dog apprehended one of the suspects. The area was searched for other suspects by patrol officers and a police aviation unit, however no other suspects could be located. Officers were able to locate the scene of the robbery where the victim was forced to remove his wallet and all of the clothes. The victim fled the scene on foot and was located at his home.

The suspect was transported to Baltimore Washington Medical Center to be treated for several dog bite wounds.

The victim was transported to Baltimore Washington Medical Center to be treated for several minor injuries suffered during the robbery. The victim is a 17-year-old male from Severn, Maryland

The suspect who was apprehended was positively identified as being one of the subjects who was involved in committing the robbery and was charged as a juvenile with robbery, assault, and theft. The suspect is a 16-year-old male from the 500 block of Maude Avenue in Brooklyn, Maryland.
