Synopsis:

On March 28th 2008 at approximately 1836 hrs. Christopher Tucker was operating his 2002 Harley Davidson north on Edwin Raynor Blvd. approaching the exit ramp from Rt. MD100 eastbound. At this time, Carolyn Snyder was operating her 2005 Chevy Cavalier from eastbound Rt. 100, attempting to make a left onto southbound Edwin Raynor Blvd. According to the evidence at the scene and witness statements, Mrs. Snyder came to a stop at the stop sign, and then attempted to make the left turn onto Edwin Raynor Blvd. Mrs. Snyder pulled into the path of Mr. Tucker and failed to yield his right-of-way. Mr. Tucker applied the brakes on his Harley Davidson in an attempt to avoid contact with the front of Mrs. Snyder's vehicle. Mrs. Snyder struck the right side of Mr. Tucker's motorcycle ejecting him from the motorcycle.

Mr. Tucker sustained serious head injury and was flown to the University of Maryland Shock Trauma. Mr. Tucker was in critical condition at the time of this report. Mrs. Snyder sustained minor injuries and was transported to Baltimore Washington Medical Center with non-life threatening injuries.

There is no indication that speed or alcohol contributed to this crash.

On March 30th, 2008 at approximately 0055 hours Christopher Tucker died from injuries sustained in this crash. Dr. Rollstin pronounced Mr. Tucker dead at the University of Maryland Hospital.
