NORTHERN DISTRICT

ATTEMPTED ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On May 16, 2009, at approximately 12:15 a.m., officers from the Northern District responded to Champs Pizza and Subs in the 7300 block of Furnace Branch Rd in Glen Burnie for a report of an attempted robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, a 26-year-old male, who stated that two male subjects approached him with baseball bats and demanded money. The victim did not comply and the suspects chased the victim across the street before fleeing the area behind the business. The victim was uninjured during the incident. Numerous officers searched the area for the suspects, but were unable to locate them.

Suspect #1: White male, 6'5", 250lbs., wearing a dark shirt, blue jean shorts and a dark, ski mask.

Suspect #2: White male, 5'7", short brown hair, medium build, wearing a blue shirt and light-colored shorts.

ROBBERY

BROOKLYN PARK

On May 16, 2009, at approximately 11:47 p.m., officers from Northern District responded to the 7-11 in the 4000 block of Ritchie Highway in Brooklyn Park for a report of a robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, a 22-year-old female, who stated that she was in front of the business when a male subject approached and asked her for a quarter. The suspect then grabbed her wallet from her hands as she attempted to retrieve a quarter from the wallet. The suspect was accompanied by two other suspects and all fled on foot toward W. Meadow Road.

There were no reported injuries in the incident. Numerous officers and a K-9 unit searched the area, but were unable to locate the suspects.

Suspect #1: Black male in his late teens, 5'7, 140 lbs, black, knit cap, grey, hooded sweatshirt and blue jeans.

ROBBERY

ODENTON

On May 16, 2009, at approximately 9:20 p.m., officers from Western District responded to the parking lot of the Weis grocery store in the 2200 block of Blue Water Boulevard in Odenton for a report of a robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, a 20-year-old male, who advised that he and his friend were walking toward the Weis grocery store when they were approached from behind by three male subjects. One suspect fought with the victim and the other two suspects chased his friend. The two suspects eventually ended their pursuit and returned to the first victim. All three suspects punched the victim and stole a silver, Leatherman tool from the victim's pocket before fleeing on foot towards Eagle Landing Way. The victim suffered minor injuries in the incident. Numerous officers and a K-9 unit searched the surrounding communities, but were unable to locate the suspects.

Suspects: Three black males, all tall in stature and one was wearing a white, tank top shirt.

SOUTHERN DISTRICT

BURGLARY ARRESTS

EDGEWATER

On May 17, 2009, at approximately 11:37 p.m., officers from the Southern District responded to South River High School in the 200 block of Central Avenue East for an alarm call.

Upon arrival, officers discovered an un-secured door. After looking inside of the school, four suspects were observed and they fled on foot from inside the school. Police set a perimeter and a K-9 unit responded to assist in the search. After canvassing the area, two of the four suspects were apprehended on scene. The third suspect turned himself in and the other was located at his home. All of the suspects were charged with 3rd Degree Burglary, Fourth Degree Burglary, Destruction of Property and Trespassing.

Suspect #1: Derek Lawrence, 18, of 1828 Havre De Grace Drive, Edgewater, Md 21037

Suspect #2: Dominic Greenfield, 18, of 825 Hillside Avenue, Edgewater, Md. 21037. The other two suspects were juveniles.

ATTEMPTED HOMICIDE/SUICIDE

TRACYS LANDING

On Sunday, May 17, 2009, at approximately 4:40 p.m., officers from the Southern District responded to the 6200 block of Franklin Gibson Road in Tracys Landing for an attempted suicide.

Upon arrival, officers located a 21-year-old male and a 20-year-old female suffering from apparent gunshot wounds. Preliminary investigation indicated that both subjects were at the home of the boyfriend's parents when an argument took place. During the dispute, the boyfriend went into an unknown area of the home and broke into a secure, gun safe that belonged to his father. The suspect then removed a .357 caliber handgun, shot the female one time in the torso and then shot himself. The female was transported to Shock Trauma in critical, but stable condition. The male suspect, Andrew Mackall, 21, of the 6200 block of Franklin Gibson Road in Tracys Landing, died as a result of the injuries received from the gunshot wound.
