NORTHERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On May 20, 2009, at approximately 11:07 p.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the 100 block of Shelly Road in Glen Burnie for a report of a robbery of a citizen.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, a 67-year-old male, who stated that he was removing items from his vehicle in front of his home when a male subject approached him, displayed a handgun and demanded his wallet. The suspect then searched the victim's pockets and removed his wallet. The suspect was last observed fleeing the scene on foot on Shelly Road towards the Willows Apartments. The victim was not injured in the incident. Numerous officers, a K-9 unit and an Aviation unit canvassed the area, but were unable to locate the suspect.

Suspect: Male, unknown race, unknown age, tall, thin build and wearing all black clothing

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On May 20, 2009, at approximately 11:58 p.m., officers from Northern District responded to the 7-Eleven store in the 7000 block of Ritchie Highway in Glen Burnie for a report of a robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the store clerk, who advised that a male subject entered the store and attempted to purchase a soda when he pulled out a knife and demanded money. The clerk complied and handed the suspect an undetermined amount of U.S. currency. The suspect then fled the store and was last observed heading towards Crain Highway. Numerous officers searched the area, but could not locate the suspect.

Suspect: White male with brown hair and some facial hair, last seen wearing a blue, hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans and a white hat.

THEFT

ANNAPOLIS

On May 21, 2009, at approximately 2:34 a.m., officers from the Southern District responded to the 3000 block of Rockway Avenue in Annapolis for a check subjects on a community pier.

Upon arrival, officers observed two subjects jump into the water and one of the subjects was apprehended immediately while the second subject swam away. Due to the cold air and the temperature of the water, the Anne Arundel County Police Department Marine unit and a K-9 unit, the U.S. Coast Guard, the Anne Arundel County Fire Department Dive Team and a Maryland State Police Aviation unit responded to search for this subject.

Through the investigation, it was determined that the second subject had climbed out of the water by a nearby pier and was eventually located inside his residence. One of the kayaks located at the community pier was reported stolen two weeks earlier. It was determined that the two subjects were in possession of the stolen kayak and were preparing to take it out onto the water. One of the subjects was also found to be in possession of marijuana and paraphernalia.

Suspect #1: Robert J. Harmison, 18, of 3 B Street, Annapolis, MD 21401. Charged with CDS: Possession of Marijuana and Paraphernalia, Theft over 500.

Suspect #2: Samuel J. Smith, 21, of 3447 Newport Avenue, Annapolis, MD 21403. Charged with Theft over 500.
