WESTERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

HANOVER

On May 22, 2009, at approximately 9:54 a.m., officers from Western District responded to the Red Roof Inn located in the 7300 block of Parkway Drive in Hanover for report of a robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with an employee, who advised that a male subject entered the business, displayed a black handgun and demanded money. The employee indicated that she complied with the suspect's demands. The suspect removed an undetermined amount of U.S. currency from the register before fleeing the area on foot. Numerous officers and a K-9 unit searched the area, but were unable to locate the suspect.

Suspect: Black male, 6'2"-6'5" with a thin build, medium complexion, wearing a black, hooded sweatshirt, black pants, black and white shoes, a white shirt covering his face and a silver, nylon hand bag on his right shoulder.

NORTHERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On May 23, 2009, at approximately 9:10 a.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the SunTrust Bank located in the 100 block of Crain Highway South in Glen Burnie for a report of a robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with witnesses, who advised that the suspect walked into the bank with a black and blue bag. The suspect then told an employee he would like to open an account with the bank. At that time, the suspect gave the employee a note stating that he wanted money and that he had a pipe bomb in the bag. The employee complied with the demands and the suspect fled the scene on foot toward 1st Avenue. Numerous officers and a K-9 unit canvassed the area, but were unable to locate the suspect.

Suspect: Black male in his 40's with a skinny build, approximately 6'0", clean shaven, shaved head, wearing a pink, polo shirt with gray, plaid stripes and black, long pants. Additionally, he was wearing glasses with a gold frame and can be distinguished by a Chinese or Japanese tattoo on the right side of his neck.

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On May 24, 2009, at approximately 4:37 p.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the Kmart located in the 6700 block of Ritchie Highway in Glen Burnie for a report of a robbery of a citizen.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the 13-year-old male victim, who advised that he was sitting on his black, Mongoose bike in front of the Kmart when he was approached by an unknown male subject. Next, the suspect punched the victim, stole his bike and fled the area towards the rear of the shopping center. Several officers searched the vicinity, but could not locate the suspect.

Suspect: Black male in his late teens, approximately 5'6"- 5'8" with a muscular build, low cut haircut, wearing a white shirt and blue, jeans shorts.

ROBBERY

BROOKLYN PARK

On May 24, 2009, at approximately 9:37 p.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the 4000 block of Ritchie Highway in Brooklyn Park for a report of a robbery of a citizen that occurred earlier.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victims, a 29-year-old female and a 38-year-old male, who stated that 7-10 male subjects suddenly surrounded them. One suspect grabbed the female victim from behind while another suspect grabbed her purse from her hands. Next, the suspects threw her to the ground, and punched the male victim in the mouth and threw him to the ground as well. All of the suspects fled on foot towards Old Riverside Road. Several officers and a K-9 unit canvassed the area, but could not locate the suspect.

Suspects: Approximately 7-10 black males in their teens, several wearing white tank tops; one suspect was wearing a brown t-shirt.

ROBBERY/STABBING

BROOKLYN PARK

On May 25, 2009, at approximately 4:48 a.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the Harbor Hospital located in Baltimore City and spoke with a 43-year-old male victim from Finksburg, Maryland in reference to an earlier stabbing and robbery.

While speaking with the victim, officers ascertained that the victim was walking on Belle Grove Road after leaving a 7-11 in the 4000 block of Ritchie Highway when three male suspects approached him from the rear. The victim was then stabbed from behind on his left shoulder with an unknown type of weapon. The suspects took his wallet and an undisclosed amount of U.S. currency and fled the area in an unknown direction. Officers were unable to locate the suspects.

Suspect#1: Black male, 16-18 years old, 5'10"-6'0", 170 pounds, wearing black/blue baggy shorts and a blue t-shirt.

Suspect #2: Black male, 16-18 years old, 5'9", 200 pounds, wearing black/blue baggy shorts

Suspect #3: Black male, 18 years old, 6'0", wearing black/blue baggy shorts, white tank top and a black ball cap.

EASTERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On May 22, 2009, at approximately 8:37 p.m., officer from the Eastern District responded to the Pizza Choice carry-out located in the 600 block of Old Mill Boulevard in Glen Burnie for a report of an armed robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the manager, who advised that he and his employees were working inside when a male subject entered the business, brandished a handgun and demanded money after going around the counter. The suspect took an undetermined amount of U.S. currency from the register and fled on foot from the business. He was last seen headed toward the rear of the shopping plaza and may have entered a dark SUV. Numerous officers, a K-9 unit and an Aviation unit searched the area, but were unable to locate the suspect.

Suspect: Black male with a dark complexion, approximately 6'0", wearing a long, black tee-shirt, black hat and light blue jeans.

STABBING

ANNAPOLIS

On May 25, 2009, at approximately 2:11 a.m., officers from the Eastern District responded to the 1100 block of Riverbay Road in Annapolis for a report of a stabbing that just occurred.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the 22-year-old victim, who stated that he and the suspect had been drinking alcoholic beverages when an argument ensued. At some juncture, the argument escalated and the suspect stabbed the victim with a knife in the upper torso. The suspect then fled the scene on foot. The victim was taken to Anne Arundel Medical Center with non-life threatening injuries. The suspect was known to the victim and was subsequently located at his home and arrested.

Suspect: Elquire C. Brown, 36, of 997 St. Margaret's Drive, Annapolis, MD. He was charged with 1st & 2nd Degree Assault and Reckless Endangerment.

DESTRUCTION OF PROPERTY

SEVERNA PARK

On May 24, 2009, at approximately 11:18 p.m., officers from the Eastern District responded to the area of Ritchie Highway northbound near Manhattan Lane for a destruction of auto that just occurred.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the 47-year-old female victim, who stated that she was driving north on Ritchie Highway near Manhattan Lane when an object struck and shattered her front passenger window. There were two children under ten years old in the vehicle at the time. Around the same time, a second victim, a 24 year old male, was traveling in the same area when an object struck and damaged the passenger door of his vehicle. It appeared that something was thrown at the vehicles. Witness information led responding officers to the community of Manhattan Beach, where the suspects were last seen driving evasively through the community with the headlights off. Officers stopped the vehicle and subsequently arrested the three occupants upon obtaining additional evidence. There were no injuries reported in the aforementioned incidents.

Suspects: 16-year-old male and two 17-year-old males from Severna Park. All three juveniles were charged with two counts of Destruction of Property Over \$500.00.

ROBBERY

PASADENA

On May 24, 2009, at approximately 11:07 p.m., officers from the Eastern District responded to the 4400 block of Mountain Road for a report of an armed robbery at the Exxon Station.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the 39-year-old male victim, who advised that the suspect entered the store, brandished a handgun and demanded money from the register. The victim complied and the suspect took the undisclosed amount of money and fled the area in a white, Dodge min-van. Several officers check the vicinity, but could not locate the suspect.

Suspect: White male, approximately 6'0", 170 pounds with a stocking over his face and wearing dark pants and a red t-shirt.

MISSING JUVENILE FOUND SAFE

SEVERNA PARK

On May 24, 2009, at approximately 2:30 p.m., officers from Eastern District responded to 455 Larkspur Lane in Severna Park in reference to a critically missing juvenile.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the mother of the missing juvenile, who stated that on May 23, 2009, at approximately 8:30 a.m., her son, Alexander Stevens, returned to their residence to get his bike. She stated that he left riding his bike, which was described as silver, BMX Mongoose with blue lettering and a blue lock on the handle bars. The family was concerned because Alexander had never disappeared for this length of time before.

UPDATE:

Alexander Stevens was located on May 26, 2008, at approximately 1:08 a.m., at the 7-11 at Route 2 & Earleigh Heights. He was discovered safe with friends and appeared to be in good health.
