**EASTERN DISTRICT DETECTIVES MAKE SIGNIFICANT BURGLARY
ARREST**

BURGLARY ARREST

MILLERSVILLE/GLEN BURNIE

On May 22, 2009, unknown suspects committed a burglary at Helix Construction Services located in Millersville. The suspects removed a large amount of tools and caused damage to the property.

On May 26, 2009, employees of Tate Dodge in Glen Burnie reported to police that an unknown suspect had broken into the dealership and removed tires and rims from a Dodge truck parked on the dealership lot. That same day, around 5:00p.m., Detective Jack Morgan and Detective Jovone Martelle were in the area of Ritchie Highway and Ordnance Road in Glen Burnie when they observed a blue and silver Dodge Dakota pick-up truck parked in the Wal-Mart parking lot. Detective Morgan observed a set of Dodge truck wheels with tires in the open bed of the truck. The wheels had the factory stickers still attached to them. The detectives conducted surveillance on the truck and observed three subjects exit the store and leave the parking lot in the truck. Believing the wheels and tires were stolen, officers conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle. The driver, Thomas Buddenbohn, gave officers permission to search the vehicle. Consequently, officers located power tools inside the vehicle that were inscribed with the name Helix Construction Services, the company that had been burglarized on May 22, 2009. In addition, it was determined that the wheels and tires were stolen as well. The property was seized and transported to Eastern District. Mr. Buddenbohn was placed under arrest and the occupants of the vehicle were released without charges.

On May 27, 2009, at approximately 2:30 a.m., detectives from the Eastern District conducted a search and seizure warrant at Mr. Buddenbohn's address located at 94 Mary Lane in Glen Burnie. While at the residence, detectives located more tools taken from the initial burglary

on Veterans Highway and another set of Dodge wheels and tires taken in the burglary at Tate Dodge. In total, detectives recovered an estimated \$12,000 in stolen property.

Suspect: Thomas Allen Buddenbohn, Jr., 31, of 94 Mary Lane #202, Glen Burnie, Md. 21061. He was charged with three counts of 4th Degree Burglary, one count of 2nd Degree Burglary, three counts of Theft over \$500, three counts of Theft under \$500, five counts of Destruction to Property over \$500 and one count of Destruction to Property under \$500.
