CDS ARRESTS

GLEN BURNIE

On October 29, 2009, at approximately 9:00 p.m., members of the Special Enforcement Section's Tactical Narcotics Team and the Special Operation Section executed a search and seizure warrant at 6309 West Furnace Branch Road in Glen Burnie. This concluded a month-long investigation into CDS distribution activity at this residence. Detectives seized the following: 6.91 grams of "crack" cocaine with an approximate street value of \$691.00, 6.91 grams of marijuana with an approximate street value of \$207.00, CDS paraphernalia items, \$11,800.00 in U.S. Currency and a 2008 Dodge Avenger

Suspect #1: Clyde Wilson Lewis, 19, of 6309 W. Furnace Branch Road, Glen Burnie, MD. Charged with Possession with Intent to Distribute Cocaine, Possession of Cocaine, Possession of Marijuana and Possession of CDS paraphernalia

Suspect #2: David Michael Legendre, 32, 6309 W. Furnace Branch Road, Glen Burnie, MD. Charged with Possession of Cocaine.

Suspect #3: Howard Anderson Burris, 22, 6309 W. Furnace Branch Road, Glen Burnie, MD. Charged with Possession of Marijuana

ATTEMPTED ARMED ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On October 30, 2009, at approximately 9:30 p.m., officers from the Northern District responded to Vinzinni's located in the 7700 block of Baltimore Annapolis Blvd for a report of an attempted armed robbery that occurred earlier.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the male victim, who stated that he was attempting to deliver a pizza in the area of 331 Gatewater Court when he was approached by an unknown male subject who demanded money. The victim refused and was struck in the head with what appeared

to be a black semi automatic handgun. The male then fled the scene in an unknown direction. Numerous officers canvassed the area, but were unable to locate the suspect.

Suspect: White male, tall, wearing a grey hooded sweatshirt, blue jeans and a black and white bandana covering his face (possible black semi automatic handgun)

ARMED ROBBERY ARREST

GLEN BURNIE

On November 1, 2009, at approximately 10:41 p.m., officers from Northern District responded to the 7-11 convenience store located in the 7100 block of Ritchie Highway in Glen Burnie for the report of a commercial armed robbery that had just occurred.

A review of the store's surveillance video revealed that the suspect entered the store, displayed a black semi-automatic handgun and demanded money from the clerk. The suspect then fled the scene with an undetermined amount of currency. While checking the area, officers located a male subject matching the description of the suspect walking north on Crain Highway away from the scene of the robbery. He was subsequently detained for further investigation. After further investigation, the subject was determined to be the suspect involved in the armed robbery. He was subsequently charged with Armed Robbery and related offenses.

Suspect: Walter Richardson Humple, 28, of 107 Greenway Street NW, Glen Burnie, MD

ARMED ROBBERY

BROOKLYN PARK

On November 1, 2009, at approximately 8:57 p.m., officers from Northern District responded to Harbor Hospital located in the 3500 block of South Hanover Street in Baltimore for a report of an armed robbery that occurred earlier.

While at Harbor Hospital, officers spoke with the male victim, who advised that he was in the 5500 block of Ritchie Highway in Brooklyn when four male subjects robbed him. The victim advised that one of the males brandished a box cutter and cut him on the arm. The victim was then tackled and assaulted as he attempted to flee. During the assault, the suspects reached into the victims pockets and stole an unknown amount of U.S. currency. The suspects then got into a dark-colored SUV and fled towards Morgan Road in Brooklyn. The victim was then transported by a family member to Harbor Hospital with non-life threatening injuries. The investigation is ongoing at this time.

ARMED ROBBERY

ODENTON

On November 1, 2009, at approximately 12:16 p.m., officers from Western District responded to the Baltimore Washington Medical Center located in the 300 block of Hospital Drive in Glen Burnie for a report of a citizen robbery that occurred earlier.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the victim, who reported that he was robbed earlier in the 1300 Block of Odenton Road in Odenton. The victim advised that he was approached by an unknown suspect, who struck him over the head and knocked him to the ground. At that time, three other suspects kicked the victim, ripped a necklace from around his neck and took an unknown amount of U.S. currency from him. During this struggle, the victim suffered a cut to his left arm from an unknown cutting device. The victim was able to flee the area and went to Baltimore Medical Washington Medical Center, where he was treated and released.
