WESTERN DISTRICT

ARMED CARJACKING ARREST

HANOVER

On November 3, 2009, at approximately 1:17 p.m., officers from the Western District responded to the 7000 block of Arundel Mills Circle in Hanover for a report of an armed carjacking.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the male victim, who reported that he was returning to his vehicle when he was approached by a male subject armed with a handgun. The suspect pointed the handgun at the victim and demanded that he empty his pockets and turn over his car keys. The victim complied with the demands and gave the suspect his cell phone, an undetermined amount of U.S. currency and the keys to his Infiniti G35. The suspect then entered the vehicle and fled the scene.

A short time later, officers located a vehicle matching the description pulling into Meade High School on Annapolis Road. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle and the driver jumped from the car and fled on foot. Numerous officers and an Aviation unit immediately entered the area and set up a perimeter in an attempt to locate the suspect. Meade High School and Meade Middle School were both briefly locked down to ensure the safety of the students and staff during this incident. Within minutes, the suspect, **Adrian Lamar Loney**, 16, of 1437 Gesna Drive in Hanover, was located and placed under arrest. Additionally, officers recovered the handgun from the vehicle. The suspect was uninjured during the incident; however, he was treated and released at Baltimore Washington Medical Center for a pre-existing condition.

He has been charged as an adult with the following: Armed Carjacking, Armed Robbery, 1st Degree Assault, Use of a Handgun in the Commission of a Violent Crime, Handgun in Vehicle, Handgun on Person, Theft over \$10,000, Theft of a Motor Vehicle and CDS Possession: Marijuana.

BURGLARY ARREST**HANOVER**

On November 3, 2009, at approximately 10:27 a.m., officers from the Western District responded to the 2100 block of Piney Branch Circle in Hanover for a report of a burglary.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the female victim, who advised that a male suspect attempted to pry open the front door of the apartment and then fled the scene in a white Acura. A responding officer observed a vehicle matching the suspect description in the area and initiated a traffic stop. The two occupants inside the vehicle were detained and subsequently identified as the suspects. Both suspects were charged with 1st Degree Burglary, 2nd Degree Burglary, 4th Degree Burglary and Destruction of Property.
