NORTHERN DISTRICT

ROBBERY

BROOKLYN PARK

On November 19, 2009, at approximately 7:23 p.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the 100 block of 1st Avenue in Brooklyn Park for a report of an assault on a citizen.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with the 48-year-old male victim, who stated that he was in the area when he was approached by four male subjects. One suspect used a skateboard to strike the victim and another suspect used a bicycle to strike him. Consequently, the victim fell to the ground and the suspects managed to steal his wallet and keys from his pockets. The suspects then fled the location on foot. The victim sustained minor injuries and was treated and released from Harbor Hospital. Several officers canvassed the area, but were unable to locate the suspects.

Suspects: Four black males in their teens, approximately 5'9", all wearing dark clothing. One suspect was riding a skateboard and another was riding a bicycle.

ROBBERY

GLEN BURNIE

On November 19, 2009, at approximately 8:37 p.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the Rite Aid located in the 7500 block of Ritchie Highway in Glen Burnie for a report of a theft.

Upon arrival, officers spoke to a Loss Prevention representative, who advised that a male and female subject entered the store and attempted to take property. The Loss Prevention representative approached the suspects and a brief struggle ensued. During the struggle, one suspect displayed a knife and shook it at the Loss Prevention representative. Both suspects then entered a Ford pick-up truck that was occupied by a third suspect and they fled the scene northbound on Ritchie Hwy. Officers canvassed the area and located the suspect vehicle in a

parking lot in the 7100 block of Ritchie Highway. The suspects were identified, arrested and charged with Robbery, Armed Robbery and other related charges.

ARMED ROBBERY

BROOKLYN PARK

On November 18, 2009, at approximately 10:55 p.m., officers from the Northern District responded to the Pizza Hut located in the 6700 block of Ritchie Highway S. in Glen Burnie for a report of an armed robbery that occurred earlier at another location.

Officers spoke with the male victim, who reported that he was in his vehicle in the community of Pumphrey near the intersection of Gibbons Avenue and Bishop Avenue around 10:30 p.m., when he was approached by three male subjects and a female subject. Two of the suspects were armed with handguns and demanded money. The victim complied and turned over an undetermined amount of U.S. currency. The suspects subsequently then fled the area.

Through investigation, officers were able to identify the four suspects and secure evidence that led to their arrests. All suspects in this case have been charged with Armed Robbery and other related offenses.

ARMED ROBBERY

LINTHICUM

On November 20, 2009, just after midnight, officers from the Northern District responded to the Ruby Tuesday restaurant located in the 900 block of International Drive in Linthicum for a report of an armed robbery.

Upon arrival, officers spoke with employees, who said that a male subject entered the business after several employees left for the night. The suspect displayed a handgun and demanded that the manager open the safe. The manager complied and turned over an undetermined amount of money. The suspect then forced the employees into a freezer and fled the business in an unknown direction. Numerous officers searched the area, but could not locate the suspect.

Suspect: Black male, wearing a scarf over his face, a baseball hat, black jeans and green/grey coat
