

❖ NORTHERN PATROL DISTRICT

The Northern Patrol District geographically encompasses approximately 42 square miles or nearly 10% of the total county's 416 square miles. The estimated 2003 U.S. Census population for the Northern Patrol District was 84,083. Authorized staffing for the Northern Patrol District is comprised of 131 sworn and eight civilians. Some of the highlights for the Northern Patrol District for 2003 included:

- In September 2003, the Police Community Relations Council selected Officer Michael Haviland as the Northern District Police Officer of the Year. Officer Haviland's selection was based on his consistently high performance standards, self-motivation, and professionalism. Well-respected by his peers, Officer Haviland has been recognized by our Chief of Police, the MADD, the State Highway Administration, and the Sheriff's Department for his traffic enforcement efforts. Officer Haviland has proven very successful in making numerous arrests for drug possession stemming from traffic stops. Additionally, Officer Haviland has shown remarkable tenacity in criminal investigations. In one instance, his assistance on a bank robbery investigation led to the arrest of three suspects and the recovery of \$88,000.
- In February 2004, Officer Sean Genest, a three-year veteran assigned to the Northern Patrol District was honored with the Glen Burnie Elks Lodge #2266, Public Servant Award. The award was given to Officer Genest for his exemplary performance in law enforcement.
- Officers Nicholas DiPietro and John Hall were nominated by the Baltimore Sun as Police Officers of the Year for excellence in law enforcement and outstanding service to the community. Although they did not receive an award, they were recognized for their accomplishments during the ceremony. Officer DiPietro was recognized for his diligence in traffic enforcement and the number of criminal arrests made. Officer Hall has made several notable arrests of different suspects involved in cases such as an armed robbery, a bank robbery, a violent domestic and a carjacking.

❖ EASTERN PATROL DISTRICT

The Eastern Patrol District geographically encompasses approximately 80 square miles or nearly 19% of the total county's 416 square miles. The estimated 2003 U.S. Census population for the Eastern Patrol District was 161,132. Authorized staffing for the Eastern Patrol District is comprised of 137 sworn and eight civilians. Some of the highlights for the Eastern Patrol District for 2003 included:

- In April 2003, the Police Community Relations Council selected Sergeant Daniel Yerkey, a 35-year veteran, as the Eastern District Sergeant of the Year.
- The Tactical Patrol Unit, the Tactical Narcotics Team, the Eastern District Bike Patrol, and Reserve Officers performed traffic and crowd control for the annual free outdoor movie night at Kinder Park in Severna Park. Approximately 10,000 people attended the event.
- In July 2003, Tactical Patrol Unit officers conducted two safe student driver workshops at Old Mill High School where over 300 students were addressed regarding safe driving habits and responsibilities.
- Officer Michael Morningstar was selected as the Eastern District Officer of the Year for 2003. Officer Morningstar's selection was based on his dedication to duty, high performance standards in traffic enforcement and criminal enforcement activities, community service, and his display of professionalism.
