

CIVIL VIOLATIONS

<p>Art. CR 10-113: Misrepresentation of Age to Obtain Alcoholic Beverage From a Licensed Seller. (... did knowingly make a [misrepresentation/false statement] as to the age of [themselves/another person] to any person licensed to sell alcoholic beverages for the purpose of unlawfully [obtaining/having furnished to a person] an alcoholic beverage.)</p>	<p>Civil Citation Must Appear Maximum Penalty: \$500/no jail</p>
<p>Art. CR 10-114: Possession of Alcoholic Beverages by Persons Under Age 21. (... did unlawfully possess (a)(1) or consume (a)(2) an alcoholic beverage.) [Exceptions: (1) If an adult furnishes the alcoholic beverage to the individual or allows the individual to possess or consume the alcoholic beverage; the individual possessing or consuming the alcoholic beverage and the adult who furnished the alcoholic beverage to the individual or allowed the individual to possess or consume the alcoholic beverage are members of the same immediate family; and the alcoholic beverage is furnished and consumed in a private residence of the adult or within the cartilage of the residence. (2) The individual consumes the alcoholic beverage as a participant in a religious ceremony.]</p>	<p>Civil Citation Must Appear Maximum Penalty: \$500/no jail</p>
<p><i>Art. CR 10-115: Possession of False Identification Card or Document by Persons Under Age 21. (...did possess a card or document that falsely identifies the age of the individual under circumstances that reasonably indicate an intention to purchase or possess an alcoholic beverage.</i></p>	<p>Civil Citation Must Appear Maximum Penalty: \$500/no jail</p>

<p>Art. CR 10-118: Keg Registration: (a) Possession of an Unregistered Keg. (... did possess a keg that [has not been registered/does not have a registration form attached/registration form has been altered or obliterated.] (b) Permitting Person Under Age 21 to Consume Any Contents of a Keg Purchased by That Person. (... did permit an individual under 21 years of age to consume any of the contents of a keg purchased by them.)</p>	<p>Civil Citation Must Appear Maximum Penalty: \$500/no jail</p>
<p>Art. CR 10-126: Alcoholic Beverage Consumption or Possession of Open Container in Passenger Area of Motor Vehicle (... did possess an open container of an alcoholic beverage in a motor vehicle)</p>	<p>Civil Citation <u>Payable Fine:</u> \$25.00/no jail</p>
<p>Education Article, Title 26, Sec. 103: Drinking or Possession of Intoxicating Beverages on School Premises. (... did drink/possess intoxicating beverages on school property.)</p>	<p>Civil Citation Must Appear Maximum Penalty: \$500/no jail</p>

MUNICIPAL INFRACTION SECTION

<p>A.A. Co. Code, Art. 9, Title 1, Sec. 706 (c): Noise in Residential Districts. (At Any Time) (1) (... did [use/operate/permit the use or operation of] a [radio/tape player/disc player/boom box/phonograph/or similar sound device] at an unreasonably loud volume in a residential district); (2) (... did [use/operate/permit the use or operation of] an <u>amplified</u> musical instrument at an unreasonably loud volume at a residence.); or (2300 - 0700) (3) (... did [use/operate/permit the use or operation of] a [musical instrument/machine/tool/or similar device] at an unreasonably loud volume in a residential district between 2300 - 0700). (“Unreasonably Loud” for subsection (c) means “the sound generated can be heard at a distance of 50 feet from device.”) (A warning is not required before charging.)</p>	<p>Civil Citation <u>Payable Fine:</u> 1st Violation: \$50 2nd Violation: \$100 3rd Violation: \$500 Maximum Penalty: \$500/no jail</p> <hr/> <p>Criminal Charge Art. 9, Title 1, Sec. 706 (d) <u>Arrest/Criminal Citation</u> Failure to cease operation of device after being ordered by a police officer. Animal Control Laws

- Article 12 Section 4-402 Public Safety Threat
An animal poses a public safety threat if the animal:
 - Inflicts severe injury to a person;
 - Bites a person;
 - Kills or inflicts severe injury to a domestic animal;
 - Attacks a person;
 - Without provocation, chases or approaches a person in an attitude of attack; or
 - Engages in encouraged dog-fighting activity or shows evidence of having been engaged in encouraged dog-fighting activity.

- Article 12 Section 4-601 Rabies Vaccination
(a) Anyone who owns or harbors a cat or dog 4 months of age or older must have the animal vaccinated for rabies.
(c) Failure of owner to provide evidence of a current rabies vaccination pursuant to item (a).

- Article 12 Section 4-702(a) Licensing
The owner of any dog or cat 4 months of age or older must obtain a license for the animal.

- Article 12 Section 4-801 & 802 Dogs And Other Animals Outdoors
Animal Control should be contacted regarding violations or concerns related to animals maintained outdoors during normal business hours. Animals appearing to be in distress warrant a prompt response by Animal Control at any time..

- Article 12 Section 4-903 Public Nuisance
The owner of an animal may not permit the animal to be a public nuisance or to cause a public nuisance condition. Public nuisance includes the following acts by an animal:
 - Molesting pedestrians
 - Chasing vehicles
 - Damaging property of someone other than the owner of the animal

- Article 12 Section 4-904 Animal Disturbance Prohibited
It is unlawful for a person who owns, keeps, or has possession of an animal to permit the animal to disturb the quiet of a person or neighborhood.

- Article 12 Section 4-905 Running at Large
“At Large” means off the property of an animal’s owner and not leashed and not under the control of a responsible person.

- Article 12 Section 4-909 Removal of Animal Excreta
The owner of any animal shall be responsible for the removal of any excreta deposited by his or her animal on public walks, recreation areas, or private property other than his own.

Fine For Above Violations - \$50.00 1st Offense
\$100.00 2nd Offense
\$500.00 3rd and Subsequent Offense
