What We Do

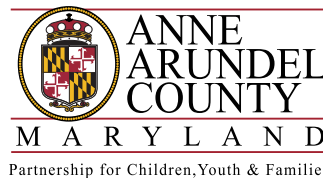
Our goal is to provide a single point of entry to link families to appropriate agencies and community-based supports.

Connect to Family Navigation and Community Support Teams

(CRICT and EC CRICT Teams)

Families partner with our staff (family navigators) and/or agency representatives to develop Individualized Action Plans that meet the family's needs.

To Access Family Navigation Services:

Simply call the Systems of Care line at 1-800-485-0041 and speak to one of our navigators.

To Connect with the Community Support Team:

Call 1-800-485-0041 to schedule a 1-hour meeting with the Community Resource Initiative/ Care Team (CRICT) or the Early Childhood CRICT team. At the meeting, the team will help develop an Individualized Action Plan in partnership with the family. After the meeting, the family and our staff (with support from team members) will implement the Action Plan. Our staff will follow-up with the family and other involved parties to ensure the family's needs are met.
