# From the County Executive



For Anne Arundel County to become the best place to live, work and start a business, we need to have the best schools.

I am proud to report that we have made some exciting strides toward building smaller high schools and making Crofton High School our first incrementally new high school built in Anne Arundel County since 1982.

Consulting firm MGT America has published a report recommending the school after a thorough examination of our needs, assets and challenges for the future.

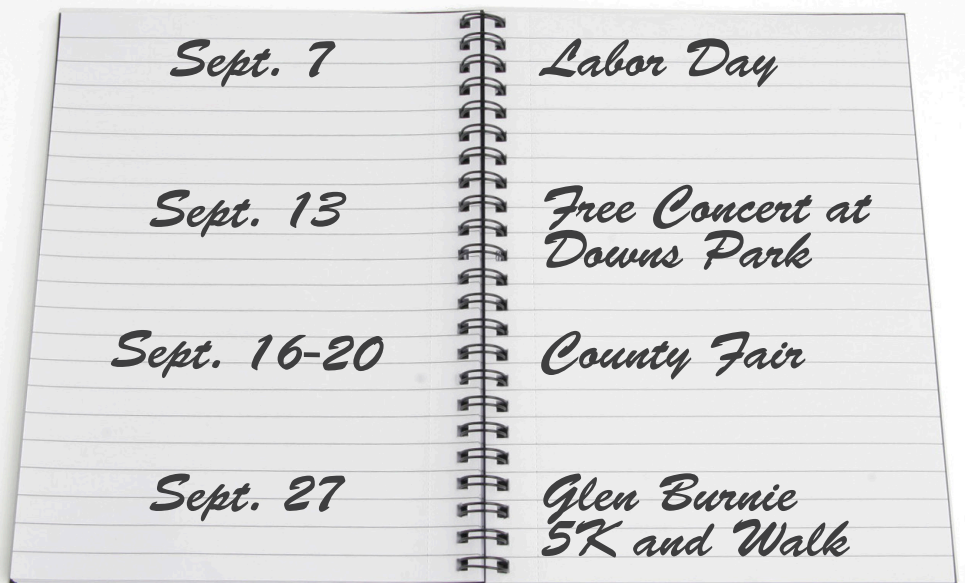
Additionally, Anne Arundel County Public Schools Superintendent George Arlotto has recommended funding for Crofton High School in his budget presented to the Board of Education.

Dr. Arlotto has been a vital partner in our efforts to improve education and close the achievement gap, and we are excited about the commitment from all parties to address a critical need in West County.

There were several interesting findings in the MGT study: 1.) We should limit the size of new high schools to 1,600 students to maximize performance and efficiency, 2.) Building Crofton High School should be a top priority, and 3.) Old Mill High School needs to be split into two smaller schools.

There is a lot of work yet to be done in order for us to break ground. My commitment is to make sure that we plan properly and that the funding and resources necessary to make Crofton High School a reality are provided by my Administration.

Maryland Live! is a great place for entertainment that also supports 3,000 jobs in our community. Bill 87-15 creates a tax increment development district that will provide for the public infrastructure to support a 300-room hotel and a 30,000 square-foot conference center. The way it works is that bonds are issued by the County and backed by revenue generated by the projects. In return, our community receives a free venue for our high school graduations and more tax revenue. As the sponsor of this legislation, I urge you to come testify in support at our public hearing on Sept. 21.
