From the County Executive



My budget proposal for the Fiscal Year that begins July 1 has several initiatives to improve our quality of life.

One of those is funding to increase street sweeping by 40 percent to 7,500 miles of curbside every single year.

While we often focus on paving roads or filling potholes when discussing road maintenance, we forget how important it is to ensure they remain free of debris and trash.

An effective street sweeping program is good for the environment, instills a sense of pride in our communities, and results in a better quality of life for our citizens.

The County Council is expected to vote on the budget June 14th, and I hope our citizens will come out or contact their representative to support this modest proposal that reduces taxes and fees but also makes key targeted investments in new public water access sites, bike trail improvements, dredging of our waterways, road improvements and so much more.

The budget also contains the elimination of fees on movie tickets, athletic facilities and mobile home communities, as well as pay increases for teachers, firefighters and police officers. Plus, we will start construction on Crofton High School, the new Annapolis library and a new Police Academy.

Thank you for your role in making these initiatives a reality.

Helpful Safety Tips

Mosquito season is here, and there are several things you can do to prevent the spread of Zika and other mosquito-borne diseases. The first step is to protect yourself from mosquito bites. Use insect repellent with DEET, and don't forget to spray the kids. Wear protective clothes when you are working outside. The second step is to prepare your home and yard. Check your doors and windows to make sure they have screens and repair any damaged screens. Look for standing water around your property that could be a breeding ground for mosquitoes. This can include anything from a bucket, tarp, toys or tires to a wheelbarrow, neglected pool, birdbath or pond. There are products available to treat pools and ponds in order to kill mosquito larvae. Enjoy the summer and make sure Zika is not part of the experience!
