Use face paint

instead of masks when possible so it is easier to see.

# From the County Executive



County Executives from Howard, Harford, and Anne Arundel all gathered for a tri-county summit on opioid and heroin abuse this month. Joining us in the discussion were Lieutenant Governor Boyd Rutherford and WBAL radio and television personality Keith Mills.

Over the course of four hours, officials and experts discussed the science of addiction, partnerships between law enforcement and addiction specialists, and the expansion of drug court. Throughout these conversations it became evident that our county is not alone in the struggle against this scourge. It is in every community, neighborhood, and town across

our state and our nation. Winning this war will be a long, converted effort.

Heroin is Anne Arundel County's number one public safety, health and educational challenge. Its tentacles reach into every aspect of human existence. We will not turn the tide overnight, but I believe we are putting the right strategies in place here to help stem it. The epidemic is so bad that we are experiencing two fatalities a week here in Anne Arundel County. We must address this problem.

Our office has been instrumental in raising awareness in our fight against heroin through our Not My Child education program, which recently received the National Associations of Counties Award for Civic Education and Public Information.

During the program, parents, county officials, and those who have suffered from addiction tell their personal stories. By helping share others' stories of addiction, our Constituent Services Director Nancy Schrum and her team have help provide a first-hand education for students and parents across our County. We plan to continue shining a light on this problem so that the community can rebound.

A new tax break I'm introducing could really help revitalize our communities. Here's how it works: If you tear down a house worth up to \$400,000, the County will waive your permit fees to build a new house, including the foundation. You will also pay property taxes based on the old assessment for five years. I believe this will raise property values in neighborhoods, encourage more energy efficient homes being built and eliminate eyesores. I believe the County will recoup these costs when the tax break ends after five years with a house generating more tax revenue.
