Bill 59-21 – Public Safety – Traffic – Vehicles on Public Sidewalks

PURPOSE STATEMENT. The purpose of this NOTICE is to inform interested or affected parties of the passage of the above referenced Bill on July 19, 2021, which is effective 45 days after voted into law.

Subsection 21-1103(a) of the Transportation Article of the State Code prohibits driving any vehicle on a sidewalk or in a sidewalk area other than a driveway. However, subsection (b) of that section provides that a bicycle, play vehicle, or unicycle may be ridden on a sidewalk or in a sidewalk area if allowed by local ordinance.

County Council voted unanimously to approve the Bill to provide the local ordinance specified in State Code, which legalizes the use of bicycles, play vehicles, and unicycles on public sidewalks and public sidewalk areas in Anne Arundel County, unless otherwise posted.

The Bill states that riders have all rights and duties of pedestrians in the same circumstances, requires riders to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians, to obey all State and County rules of the road, and to ride at reasonable speeds and to not otherwise create a hazard.
