## What is Maryland Access Point or MAP?

Anne Arundel County Department of Aging and Disabilities is proud to be the **Maryland Access Point (MAP)** for Anne Arundel County. Our **MAP** program for older adults, individuals with disabilities, caregivers, and anyone interested in planning for their future provides a single point of entry for:

- Information about resources and services
- Assistance with benefits counseling, referral, and long term planning
- Services for caregivers
- Access to services provided by the Department of Aging and Disabilities and community resources
- Customer Service Center

Maryland Access Point of Anne Arundel County (MAP) is a trusted source of information and assistance for Anne Arundel County residents interested in planning for their current and future needs. MAP sites provide individual, person-centered options counseling to consumers seeking information, referral and assistance in navigating options for long-term care services.

## MAP can help you with:

### Guidance with Assistance and Benefits

- Provide you with information and assistance
- Evaluate your eligibility for benefit programs such as energy or property tax assistance
- Respond to both your immediate concerns and long-range needs

### Referrals to Programs and Services

- Help you develop options to stay in the community
- Help you balance needs, wants, and resources
- Refer you to local, state, and federal programs and benefits

### Planning for the Future

- Help you identify your strengths, needs, and preferences
- Help you make informed decisions about housing and long-term care
- Help you assess costs, services, and service providers

## How does the MAP program work?

- Knowledgeable **Information and Assistance Program Specialists** will receive your calls
- **MAP** staff will be able to assist you in interacting with other agencies.
- Access to **MAP** information will be available in a variety of places throughout Anne Arundel County in locations such as: area hospitals, libraries, senior centers, local colleges and universities, and a host of public/private agencies.

The goal of **MAP** is to provide access to all programs and services for which you are eligible without having to go from agency to agency. **MAP** staff will assist with benefit program applications such as Energy Assistance, Food Stamps, Homeowners Property Tax Credits, Renters Tax Credits, and Medicare and Medicaid programs. **MAP** staff can also assist with determining those programs and services which would meet a person's needs.
