2011 ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY ETHICS COMMISSION

This year's annual report is intended to provide a concise factual presentation of the work conducted by the ethics commission in 2011. Additional information about the commission is available on its <u>website</u>. A copy of this report is also available in print upon request to people who do not use the internet. The information provided in this report refers to calendar year 2011, unless otherwise indicated.

The commission's staff consists of Betsy K. Dawson, the director, and Gina Scerbo, the commission secretary, both of whom work on a part-time basis.

The commission met 13 times during 2011.

INQUIRIES

The commission received 112 ethics inquiries as well as many lobbying, financial disclosure, and other types of inquiries. (Inquiries from lobbyists and other filers are not numbered or summarized unless they result in advisory opinions.)

ADVISORY OPINIONS

The commission issued 35 written opinions. Each opinion is summarized in the <u>yearly index</u> of the commission's website and in the quarterly newsletter, the <u>Ethics Update</u>. Opinions may also be found through a <u>subject-matter index</u>. The full text of each opinion is also available through these links.

COMPLAINTS

The commission received or filed seven complaints. Four of the complaints were for late or non-filing of required statements. These complaints were dismissed upon curative action being taken. Three of the complaints were for ethics violations. One of these was closed without action, and two have not yet been resolved. A complaint was also filed against the ethics commission for violations of the Open Meetings Act. The decision, which was issued January 4, 2012, found a couple of procedural errors in the commission's practices but cleared the commission of any significant violations. That decision, which will eventually be published on the website of the Open Meetings Compliance Board, is also available on the ethics commission's website under "Informational Letters."

Also, the commission continued to pursue compliance with its 2006 order in the enforcement case against Robert J. Dvorak and Phillip S. Scheibe, C-04-10. This case, which began in 2004 with a complaint filed by then County Executive, Janet Owens, resulted in a finding by the commission that Mr. Dvorak and Mr. Scheibe had violated the post-employment provisions of the Public Ethics Law. This decision was affirmed by the Court of Appeals at *Dvorak v. Anne Arundel County Ethics Commission*, 400 Md. 446 (2007). When Mr. Scheibe and Mr. Dvorak continued to ignore the order of the commission, the commission unsuccessfully sought an order from the circuit court to compel compliance. The commission appealed the circuit court's decision to the Court of Special Appeals, which heard argument on December 10, 2008. A decision reversing, vacating, and remanding the circuit court's denial of injunctive relief was issued by the Court of Special Appeals on November 24, 2009, and is reported at *Anne Arundel County Ethics Commission v. Dvorak*, 189 Md. App. 46 (2009). In that decision, the Court of Special Appeals held that Mr. Dvorak was not entitled to receive any compensation for its efforts in the *Halle* case. Near the end of 2011, the circuit court ordered Mr. Scheibe's contingency fee to be reduced by 20%. That decision is now on appeal.

FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS

The commission is charged with the responsibility of reviewing each financial disclosure and conflict of interest statement received for completion as well as for potential conflict of interest issues. All 235 statements submitted by employees and volunteers were reviewed and a

significant number of those required amendment. There were four termination statements received and reviewed as well. These statements, including corrections and additions, are available for public inspection during ethics commission office hours. There were several late disclosure filings for which the county received \$526 in late fees.

There were 27 requests to examine and/or copy filings. As required by law, all financial disclosure filers whose statements were examined or copied, were notified of that fact.

LOBBYING

In 2011, the commission received a record number of lobbying registrations- almost twice as many registrations as in any previous year, including the last year in which comprehensive rezoning was undertaken. A total of 63 lobbyists filed 254 registrations.

Lobbying registrations, employer authorizations, and activity reports are public documents. The ethics commission staff received, reviewed, and compiled the statistics on 394 activity reports. There were several late activity reports for which the county received \$3,140 in late fees.

Although compensation reported by these lobbyists was approximately 100,000 more than the compensation reported by lobbyists last year, the increase is probably due to the increase in the number of lobbyists (+12) and the increase in the number of clients (+112). There was a notable increase in lobbying expenditures for special events for county officials.

EDUCATION

The ethics commission staff presented 7 training sessions to 84 county employees. In addition, the ethics commission provided all new county employees with its *Pocket Guide*, a mini-brochure summarizing the ethics law's conflicts of interest. The pocket guide is also provided to employees who attend ethics training. The commission also published its second brochure, entitled *What You Need to Know about the Public Ethics Law- Lobbyists*. The new brochure was distributed, along with the brochure entitled *What You Need to Know about the Public Ethics Law- Vendors and Contractors*.

The commission published three issues of its online newsletter, the <u>Ethics Update</u>. Although the *Update* is an online publication, it is available in printed form upon request.

The ethics commission is a member of the Council on Governmental Ethics Laws (COGEL), an international organization of ethics agencies and ethics law practitioners. However, due to budget constraints, the director has only attended one COGEL conference in the last six years, for which the commission covered ½ of the expenses.

The commission members continue to participate in the activities of the Southern Maryland Regional Ethics Commissions, including attendance at a local conference in the spring of 2011.

BUDGET

As in all previous years, the ethics commission conserved public resources by carefully controlling costs. The commission stopped its practice of sending notifications and disclosure forms to county employees (Groupwise participants) by mail. Instead, the commission now sends all information by e-mail only, with links to commission forms. The commission also requested non-employee disclosure filers (i.e. members of boards and commissions) to accept e-mail notifications and to access all forms via the commission's website. A number of volunteers have agreed to accept e-mail only notifications. The ethics commission closed out the fiscal year with \$3,466.18 to spare from its budget, which was returned to the general fund along with an additional \$3,675.00 from late fees and other miscellaneous receipts.

LEGISLATION

The ethics commission worked with the county attorney's office to propose amendments to the ethics law that were mandated by the Maryland State General Assembly in 2010, through Senate Bill 315, <u>chapter 277</u> of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2010. The bill that was eventually prepared, Bill 05-12, was introduced at the beginning of 2012.

CONCLUSION

The commission holds its regular meetings on the second Monday of each month, in the conference room at the commission office. Notices of its meetings are posted on its website.
