If you add this parking area so close to the water it will only create pollution for the fish,turtles & wildlife via RUN OFF! PLS KEEP THE WATERFRONT GREEN SPACE UNDISTURBED!

- This parkland is one of the few remaining natural shorelines. There are regularly bald eagles and golden eagles that nest along its shoreline. Please leave this small remaining tract of nature in North County undisturbed. The waterway in front of this land is frequently used by boaters and infrequently patrolled by DNR. There have been increased safety issues since the green haven launch site went in. There will be water safety concerns on Stoney Creek if another kayak launch site is built.

- As the organizer of a 700-member kayak and paddleboard club, I can say that the watersports community would LOVE another access point here. One suggestion I have is that nearly all non-motorized watercraft (sea kayaks, fishing kayaks, stand-up paddle boards, windsurfers) are infinitely easier to launch from a ramp, or ideally a sandy beach. A pier/dock launch is very difficult for most users. The ADA "launch chutes" are great for disabled paddlers in short boats but leave out SUPs & sea kayaks.
- Don't mess up the area; with this will come crime and issues for residents that just want peace! Taxes better not go up either! Leave it alone for the animals.
- Great job by AA County continuing to provide water access to those who cannot afford waterfront. Have parking within reasonable distance of kayak launch areas.
