## COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S MESSAGE

As we continue our efforts to ensure all Anne Arundel County residents who want the vaccine can get one, we are slowly shifting our focus from larger clinics to adding more community-based and targeted clinics. Currently, only 31% of our county's youth ages 16 and 17 have received their first dose and with young people representing a growing number of new cases, we want to remove as many barriers as possible.

Last week, we made it easy to identify which Department of Health clinics administer the Pfizer vaccine, and you can sign up at [aaccounty.org/covidvax](https://aaccounty.org/covidvax). Today, I am pleased to [announce](#) a partnership with Anne Arundel County Public Schools that will bring vaccination clinics to twelve county high schools throughout the month of May. Parents and guardians can visit <https://www.aacps.org/covidclinics>, where details will be added soon.

While young people who contract the virus tend to have milder symptoms, the fact remains that they can spread COVID to older, more vulnerable groups. Get the shot to help keep your loved ones safe.

## UPDATED HEALTH METRICS

As of 5/4/21:

- 42,756 total confirmed cases and 598\* deaths
- 250,488 residents with first dose of vaccine
- 187,765 resident fully vaccinated
- 13.2 cases per 100,000 (7-day moving average)
- 0.86 infection rate
- 5.32% positive test rate
- 56 COVID patients hospitalized (AAMC & BWMC)
