COUNTY EXECUTIVE'S MESSAGE


It's a sad morning in our county. A gunman last night in the quiet neighborhood of Maryland City near Laurel killed two adults and shot a child. He was found deceased at the scene. It was described as a domestic incident.

We all want to do something to prevent these senseless killings. Today, I am reviewing the [recommendations](#) of our Gun Violence Prevention Task Force, looking for answers. They don't come easy.

This last week, we reached another sad milestone. Over 600 Anne Arundel County residents have lost their lives to COVID-19. We all want to do something to prevent these deaths. The good news is that we can. Every COVID death from this day forward is an unnecessary tragedy - a loss of life that's on each of us to prevent. We have vaccines, we have medical professionals ready and waiting to provide shots, and we have locations across the county - across the state - available for residents to go get vaccinated, for free.

We are better than this. Make your appointment. Help others to make appointments. In the name of humanity, please do your part to save lives. This report can be your guide.

UPDATED HEALTH METRICS

As of 5/10/21:

- 43,148 total confirmed cases and 604* deaths
- 260,290 residents with first dose of vaccine
- 189,103 residents fully vaccinated
- 10.8 cases per 100,000 (7-day moving average)
- 0.83 infection rate
- 4.55% positive test rate
- 48 COVID patients hospitalized (AAMC & BWMC)
