Click on the Anne Arundel County map for news and events in your community.

Accessing County services has just become much easier.

Our new 3-1-1 system is live now. It allows you to report issues and receive feedback by phone or online.

If you are trying to reach a County department by phone, there is only one number you need to remember. Simply dial 3-1-1 and you will be directed to the right place.

The system is also available in a new application for smart phones and devices.

Simply download the application from the App Store or Google Play by searching for "Anne Arundel 311."

Once inside the application, you can report all kinds of issues, from a missed trash collection or pothole, to a lost pet or unregistered vehicles in your neighborhood.

The app will map your location, show you other similar complaints and notify you when work is complete.

The residents of the Mayo Peninsula face unique infrastructure, transportation, and public safety challenges that we are working diligently to address. Our administration is focused on making targeted investments on the peninsula to improve traffic flow, clean up waterways, upgrade public utilities, improve public safety, enhance recreational amenities, and improve public education.

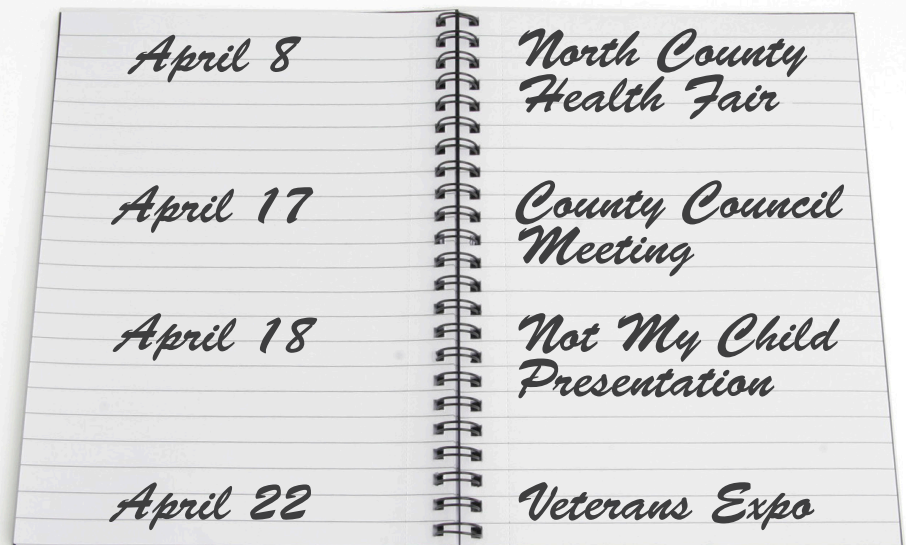
To address transportation challenges, Department of Public Works contractors are currently widening Central Avenue (Rt. 214) at the intersection of

Muddy Creek Road. In addition, over the past two years, we have resurfaced and patched roads in Glebe Heights, as well as roads in Holly Hill Harbor, Loch Haven, River Club Estates, Beverly Beach, Turkey Point, Saunders Point, and Selby on the Bay communities. Lastly, and most importantly, we are working with the Hogan Administration to accelerate additional improvements to Route 214 farther down the peninsula to improve what has become a very congested traffic chokepoint in our County.

Conceptual planning for improvements to Beverly Triton Beach Park is ongoing. Likely improvements include hiking and birdwatching trails, safer parking areas, bathroom facility upgrades, and erosion control for the beach. The latest plan includes a smaller parking area and removing an expanded manmade beach.

I look forward to continuing to work with the community to address these issues.

Helpful Safety Tips

Now that the spring weather has arrived, many of us will be outside in the yard operating power equipment. Some general safety tips include reading the owner's manual, wearing eye protection, wearing snug fitting clothing to avoid getting caught in blades, avoid working alone and have a first aid kit and water handy. Be sure to check your equipment before you use it. Look for frayed or damaged power cords. Don't use electrical equipment when it is raining. Avoid carrying a tool by the cord or yanking the cord to unplug it. Wear proper footwear when you are using a lawnmower. Use a chainsaw equipped with a chain brake, anti-kickback chain or other anti-kickback devices. When using a trimmer, stay away from poison ivy because it will spread foliage and stems all over your body. Good luck on a beautiful summer yard!
