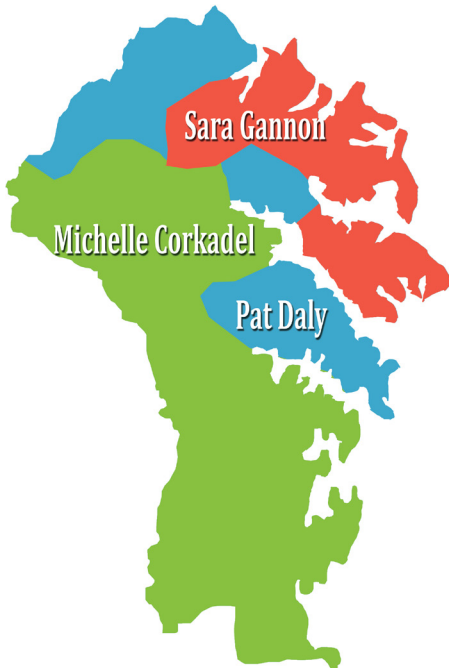

green even in the coldest time of year.

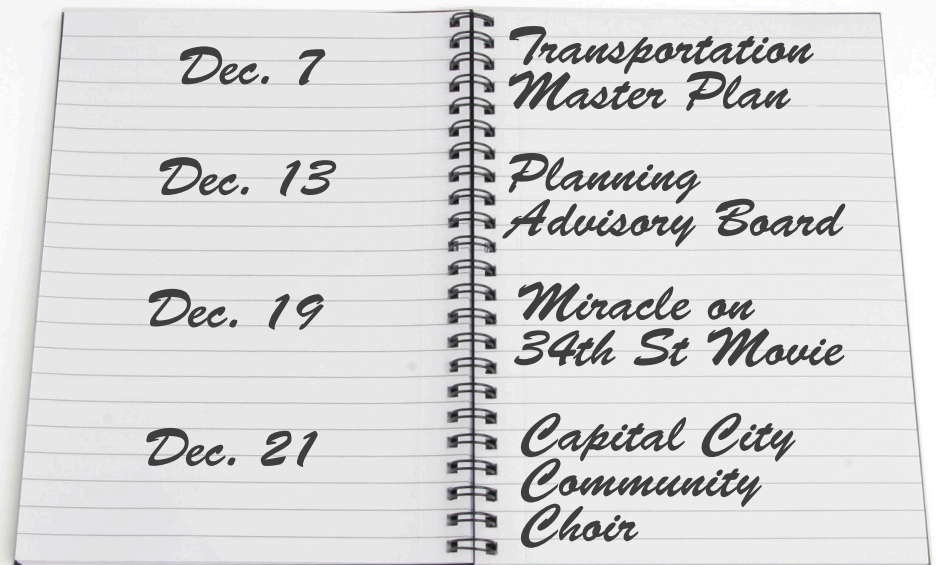

Helpful Safety Tips

Everybody loves the lights, the trees and the great food around Christmas time. Let's make sure we are safe as well. This is a good time of year to check the batteries and functionality of your smoke detectors. Be sure to lock your car and your house with all of your holiday shopping and gifts. Avoid broadcasting what items you bought on social media, and when you are leaving your house. Keep your tree watered and at least three feet away from candles, fireplaces, space heaters, radiators, vents and other heat sources. Only purchase UL-listed lights and extension cords. Don't connect too many strings of lights together (you've seen "A Christmas Story," right?) Don't overload extension cords or sockets. Finally, if you really want a Red Rider BB gun, just be sure not to shoot your eye out.
