From the County Executive



Just like baking a cake or training for a marathon, budgets can be complicated. The process is full of planning, execution and revision.

The good news is that our FY19 budget contains a last-minute addition of \$36 million that will mean faster school construction for three schools that desperately need it.

I submitted two supplemental budget requests to the County Council, adding money for mental health services in our schools and speeding up construction of Tyler Heights, Richard Henry Lee and Edgewater elementary schools.

Construction on the schools will start this summer, and they should be open for kids by 2021.


There is nothing more gratifying than building new schools to craft future leaders in our County and our society.

We believe this supplemental budget plan addresses the community's concerns regarding the funding of the three elementary schools most in need of repair and replacement. Even better, our plan does not balance our budget on the backs on future school and park planning in the County.

There are other projects included in the supplemental budget requests, including money to improve the air conditioning at Annapolis Middle School, upgrade the Dragun Science Building at Anne Arundel Community College and Maryland Hall for the Creative Arts.

I am hopeful that the County Council will support these requests, as well as the record \$684 million investment in education operating expenses.

Safety Tips

Almost everyone agrees the best part of the Fourth of July is the fireworks displays. There are tons of places to get a good view, including Saw Mill Creek Park in Glen Burnie or downtown Annapolis. If you are celebrating on your own, keep in mind that only gold-labeled products are legal in Maryland -- your sparklers, party poppers, snap pops and snakes. Using fireworks comes with danger. In 2016, a 19-year-old man suffered ear and eye injuries after a sparkler exploded in his face. In 2014, legal sparklers caused a fire and \$50,000 damage to a home in Hanover. Here are some quick tips: Never allow small children to play with or ignite fireworks, avoid fireworks packaged in brown paper, and never place any part of your body directly over a device. Have a safe Fourth!
