## A-Z Common Pet Toxins and What They May Cause in Pets

- Alcohol may cause coma, vomiting, intoxication or death
- Almonds upset stomach or obstruction of throat or intestines
- Avocado vomiting, diarrhea, heart or lung damage
- Caffeine vomiting, heart palpations, diarrhea or death
- Cedar/Pine shavings may cause death (in small animals)
- Chocolate (and cocoa mulch) - toxic to heart and nervous system or may cause
- Cooked bones stomach or throat laceration/perforation, choking or death
- Dairy (milk/ice cream) diarrhea and digestive issues
- Ethylene glycol (ingredient in some anti-freezes and snow globes) - stumbling, vomiting, seizures, kidney failure or may cause death
- Fatty foods vomiting, diarrhea or pancreatitis
- Fertilizers stomach upset and gastrointestinal obstruction
- Fumes from non- stick cooking surfaces and self cleaning ovens (in birds) may cause sudden death
- Garlic blood cell damage and anemia
  - Grapes kidney failure (from single instance or cumulative over time)
- Hops (used in beer brewing) - increasing respiration, increased heart rate, vomiting, abnormal clotting or death
- Human Medications (over the counter and prescription) - may cause death, depends

- on the medication, always consult a veterinarian or pet poison hotline
- Human Vitamins and Minerals - may cause death consult a veterinarian or pet poison hotline
- Macadamia Nuts seizures, vomiting, lethargy or nervous and muscle system damage
- Marijuana vomiting, diarrhea, increased heart rate, seizures or coma
- Mold death
- Mushrooms (certain types including wild) - shock, seizures, coma, vomiting or death
- Nutmeg (high levels) tremors, seizures, nervous system abnormalities or death
- Onions blood cell damage and anemia
- Pesticides and Rodent Poison - may cause vomiting, diarrhea or death
  - Plants (Most common azaleas, lilies, hyacinth, mistletoe, poinsettia, daffodils, crocus, cyclamen, kalanchoe, oleander, lily of the valley, sago palm, tulip, dieffenbachia, rhododendron) - stomach upset, convulsions, depression of central nervous system or death
- Pistachios stomach upset or obstructions of throat or intestines
- Raisins/Currants diarrhea. vomiting or kidney failure (from single instance or cumulative over time)

Raw eggs – food poisoning (salmonella, e. coli, etc), vomiting or biotin deficiency which causes skin issues

- Rhubarb abnormalities with nervous system, kidneys and digestive tract
- Salt (from ocean sea water, play dough or paint balls) neurologic signs, seizures and brain swelling
- Seeds/Pits (apple, cherry, mustard, peach, avocado, apricot, plum, persimmons, etc.) - may cause choking, intestinal inflammation, blockage, digestive upset or death\* (\*from cyanide in peach or plum pits)
- Walnuts stomach upset, blockages, seizures. vomiting, lethargy, nervous and muscle system damage
- Xylitol (common ingredient in candy) - liver failure, hyperglycemia or death
- Yeast (often in bread dough) - nausea, vomiting, diarrhea or bloat which can cause death
