## A BILL ENTITLED

1	AN ORDINANCE concerning: Public Ethics - Conflicts of Interest - Secondary
2	Employment by County Police Officers

4	FOR the purpose of repealing provisions that exempt secondary employment by County
5	police officers from certain restrictions under County ethics code in order to comply
6	with State law; repealing the related definition of "tavern"; and generally relating to
7	public ethics.

12	SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County,
13	Marylana, That §§ 7-1-101(25) and 7-5-102(b)(5) and (6) of the Anne Arundel County
14	Code (2005, as amended) are hereby repealed.

[(25) "Tavern" means an establishment that has as its primary business purpose the sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption on the premises. "Tavern" does not include an establishment that meets the definition of a restaurant under the rules and regulations of the Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel County.]

## TITLE 5. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

## 7-5-102. Employment or financial interests; general restriction.

(b) Exceptions. The prohibitions of subsection (a) do not apply:

[(5) to secondary employment by a County police officer in an establishment or in the parking area of an establishment where liquor is sold or served, provided that the secondary employment:

(i) does not take place inside of a tavern or a business that offers as its primary service the sale or dispensing of alcoholic beverages;

(ii) is not performed within an outdoor serving area of an establishment licensed to sell or dispense alcoholic beverages; and

(iii) does not include the duty under that secondary employment to sell, serve, or handle alcoholic beverages, check identification or otherwise screen patrons for admission to the establishment, or remove intoxicated or unruly patrons from the establishment; or

(6) to secondary employment by a County police officer in an establishment licensed by the County to conduct commercial bingo, provided that the secondary employment does not include the duty under that secondary employment to operate or assist with the operation of the bingo games, or enforce the prohibition against underage patrons.]

SECTION 3. And be it further enacted, That this Ordinance shall take effect 45 days from the date it becomes law.
