Background Report On Transportation



May 2008

I. Introduction and Background

Since the adoption of the 1997 *Anne Arundel County General Development Plan*, several change agents have occurred within the County creating redistributions and reassignments in travel flow, increases in travel demand, changes in modes of travel, and other influences on the mobility of the County's residents and work force and accessibility to its activity centers.

In no special order, among those are:

- Arundel Mills with more than 2.5 million square feet of retail, residential, office space, a campus of Anne Arundel Community College and other uses and activities. As a regional activity center, the development is connected to the regional highway network with an interchange on MD 100 and on MD 295, plus highway improvements to Ridge Road (MD 713) and construction of Arundel Mills Boulevard. Arundel Mills has been noted as the largest single tourist destination in the State of Maryland. This offers a significant impact to the highway network both in terms of trips locally as well as longer distance travel.
- Baltimore Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI) entering its last stages of a \$1.8 billion expansion program including land side facilities such as an 8,400-space parking garage, 500,000 square feet of new terminal space, security upgrades, eleven new aircraft gates, a consolidated rental car facility permitting 11,000 spaces of rental car storage and activity, pedestrian and transit access improvements, and increases in immediate accessible parking. Contrasting industry trends in commercial aviation, BWI will serve more than 21 million passengers in 2008 most of which use the airport for origin or destination purposes. This is a key issue as it creates significant travel demand on highway and transit facilities serving the County. BWI also is expanding its air cargo operations moving approximately 600 million pounds of air freight in 2005. Another fact noted by increased demand for truck borne freight movement in and around the airport is also leading to increased travel demand on major highway facilities serving the airport such as I-195, MD 295, I-97, I-695 and MD 170.
- Parole Growth Management Area that has recently added the Annapolis Town Center at Parole, a developing mixed used commercial/residential activity center situated along the major roadways supporting Annapolis Neck (MD 450, MD 2, MD 665, Forest Drive), and east-west travel (US 50/301). Also included in this rapidly urbanizing area is Westfield Shopping Center (Annapolis Mall), Anne Arundel Medical Center and other commercial and denser residential development. The combination of development projects in this area generates substantial travel demand placing strains on traditional travel corridors connecting Annapolis Neck to Maryland's Eastern Shore, Washington D.C. and its suburban jurisdictions, and with Southern Maryland.
- Fort George G. Meade, along with its major Department of Defense tenant, the National Security Agency (NSA), combine to occupy over 5,000 acres of land between the Prince George's County (Patuxent River) boundary to the south, MD 175 to the north, the Northeast Corridor (AMTRAK, CSX rail lines) to the east and the Baltimore Washington

Parkway (BWP) to the west. This Federally-controlled, secure installation supports a daytime population of more than 42,000 people, both uniformed military and Department of Defense civilian workforce. There are plans to relocate more than 5,700 new jobs to the site from Northern Virginia and other locations nationwide. Those direct jobs will generate an additional 6,000 estimated contractor jobs. Combined, those two collections of employment will increase area household income, creating a demand for an estimated 11,000 additional (or induced) jobs, mostly in the service industries. Primary employment transferring to Fort Meade through the 2005 Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) recommendations will change the mission of the Fort Meade campus from a deployment center to an employment center. The transportation implication of this action will be increased travel demand on area roadways, especially portions of the network linking the Washington suburbs with the installation and with residential areas within the County and neighboring Prince George's and Howard Counties.

- The William Preston Lane Memorial (Chesapeake Bay) Bridge, although a fixture in the 1997 highway network, is gaining influence in travel assignments along the US 50/301 corridor. Mostly sparked by residential development occurring in Queen Anne's, Caroline and Talbot Counties located on Maryland's Eastern Shore, the greatest component of growth in travel demand across the Bay span are origins and destinations in these three jurisdictions. Current travel counts on the bridge are approximately 70,000 per average (non weekend, holiday or summer) travel day. When those events occur, travel demand increases to approximately 90,000 per day. Forecasts of future travel demand based on forecasts of land use changes on both sides of the Bay indicate that by 2015 average daily travel will mirror the level of demand experienced on holiday and summer weekends.
- Western County development, while again occurring during and before the completion of the 1997 GDP, is increasing. Three of the major anchors of that development, BWI, Fort Meade, and Arundel Mills are noted above. Highway capacity, available and appropriately zoned land, proximity to Howard County and the Intercounty Connector in Prince George's and Montgomery Counties, and the currently reasonable drive time lengths to both Washington and Baltimore will continue to support this area's development. The implications of this growth will be increased travel demand on north-south facilities such as the Baltimore-Washington Parkway (BWP or MD 295), MD 170 and MD 713 (both of which parallel the BWP), east-west facilities such as MD 32, MD 175 and MD 100 providing access to development activity and north-south facilities, and as appropriate, MARC rail transit and its feeder bus services.

Combined, these change agents exert travel demands on the existing and planned highway and transit network over the span of this GDP Update. Since some of these activities are only partially controlled or accountable to County development regulations, outside (State and/or Federal) funding participation will be necessary to reduce the impact of this impending growth. Based on the 2035 demographic (population and employment) forecast, growth in employment will lead to an increase in jobs per household (1.65 jobs per household). The mobility challenge of these households to jobs and the opportunities for employment will require either increases in automobile ownership per household (currently 1.92 automobiles per household based on the

U.S. Census) or in greatly improved transit availability both in the coverage of area and in the span of service (hours of operation).

Changes in the Transportation Network

Residents, travelers and workers within Anne Arundel County are afforded several modes of travel opportunities depending upon their trips' origins and destinations. The various modes of travel available within the County and connecting the County to and beyond the Baltimore and Washington areas are presented below.

Since the adoption of the 1997 *General Development Plan* (GDP), there have been few major improvements in the highway and fixed transit (rail) system. Most notable was the completion of the double-tracking of the Baltimore Central Light Rail, the multi-lane freeway sections of MD 100, and the removal of the last traffic signals along MD 32 at the entrances to Fort Meade. These improvements offer better travel connections from Anne Arundel County to Baltimore City and Baltimore County (Light Rail from Cromwell Station), high speed and long distance automobile and truck travel between Pasadena and I-95 and US 29, and between Annapolis and Columbia (including I-95 and US 29) in Howard County, respectively.

Commuting Patterns

Census information available after the 1997 GPD indicates a shift in commuting patterns favoring increased employment in the Washington Metropolitan Area from the more traditional Baltimore Metropolitan Area. Still, practically 60 percent of the employment within Anne Arundel County is held by County residents.

Of employment filled by workers commuting into the County, traditional travel patterns from the Baltimore Metropolitan Area continue to prevail, but it is important to note the growth in commuter travel from the Eastern Shore (mostly from Queen Anne's and Caroline Counties).

Commuting patterns within the County are displayed in Table 1 below:

Modes of Commuting

Commuting to work, or as technically referred to as the home-based work trip, accounts for approximately 20 percent of all average daily travel. Again, Census information indicates that the strongest commuting trend continues to be the use of single occupant automobiles as noted in Table 1 above. There appears to have been an increase in the percentage of commuting made in this fashion since the 1997 GDP. Transit as a percentage of work trip choice remains fairly small as a percentage, but does reflect an increase. Walking and biking to work also remain about the same in number, but have experienced a slight decrease in percentage as well. As technology advances and the cost of equipment to operate a home office declines, the percentage of people who telecommute and do not commute to an outside workplace has increased. Since the County is increasing its employment base in the information technology fields, this trend is likely to continue to strengthen. For commuting, especially in terms of travel occurring at or near the same time using the same facilities, this is a very good trend.

II. Modes of Travel

Fixed Guideway Transit

Light Rail Transit

There are seven Light Rail stations in the County. They are located at Nursery Road, North Linthicum, Linthicum, the BWI Business District, the BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport, Ferndale and Cromwell Station/ Glen Burnie. About 21,400 unlinked weekday trips are taken on the entire system that consists of thirty-three stations and extends to Hunt Valley in Baltimore County.



Maryland Rail Commuter System (MARC)



Anne Arundel County has four MARC Commuter Rail Stations. They are located at BWI, Odenton, Jessup and Savage. They account for a total of approximately 3,700 boardings per day with the Odenton Station accounting for over half the boardings (2,100) followed closely by BWI (1,300). The predominant travel pattern for commuters is from Anne Arundel County south to the Washington region.

Bus Transit

Maryland Transit Administration

The MTA provides three commuter bus routes in Anne Arundel County that provide service between the County and the Washington region. They are the 921, 922 and 950. The three routes account for almost 2,400 passenger trips per day. The State also provides service to the County with the MTA 14 and MTA 17 bus routes. The MTA 14 bus route services the MD 2 corridor from the Patapsco Avenue Light Rail Station to the Anne Arundel Community College. The MTA 17 bus route services both the BWI Business District and the Arundel Mills Complex.

Corridor Transportation Corporation (CTC) Connect A Ride and SCOTS Services

The CTC provides transit service for the County to Laurel, Jessup/ Maryland City, Arundel Mills, Odenton, Glen Burnie, Pioneer City and Seven Oaks. It has recently taken over the service from the City of Annapolis south along MD 2 to Edgewater, South River Colony, Shadyside and Deale. CTC carries about 1.5 million annual passenger trips. The cost of operating the B, F, J

and K routes is borne through a combination of Federal, State and County grants, plus revenue from the sale of passenger tickets. Routes operated by CTC under its Connect-A-Ride services link the County to Prince George's, Montgomery and Howard Counties. Since the capital assets of transit (garages and vehicles) are not owned by the County, the cost of operating the routes is increasing by the cost of depreciation of the

assets owned by CTC's operator. These cost increases do not reflect the increased cost of motor fuel, insurance and labor costs which combine to about 80 percent of the hourly cost to provide transit service.

Annapolis Transit

Annapolis Transit (AT) services the greater Annapolis area (including Arnold and Edgewater) as well as the BWI Thurgood Marshall International Airport. The system consists of three shuttle routes and a fixed route system that is composed of eleven routes. In total they carry over 1.3 million annual passenger trips. Recently, the City of Annapolis was notified by the Federal Transit Administration of the loss of operating subsidy funds previously available because of its



statistics and definitions used by the US Department of Transportation have changed, causing the City of Annapolis to lose those funds. AT funding comes from various Federal, State and local sources as well as an operating subsidy grant provided by the County. The loss of a substantial portion of the operating funds will probably impact the extent of service provided by AT going forward in time.

Annapolis Transit Bus

Rideshare Car and Van Pooling

With more than 500,000 citizens and 12,800 employers, Anne Arundel County has one of the state's largest work forces. The County is experiencing a constant increase in travel demand that can lead to congestion of the highway network and even the transit network if the demand is not managed. This can be attributed not only to an estimated 112,000 county residents who commute outside of Anne Arundel County for work, but also the 144,000 in-county commuters coupled with an influx of 82,000 commuters from neighboring jurisdictions.

Unlike many jurisdictions in the State, Anne Arundel County uses two private concerns to administer and promote rideshare, car and van pool opportunities within the County. These agencies are affiliated with business and chamber of commerce organizations and are uniquely positioned to promote other forms of mobility among the membership base that includes all of the largest employers in the County.

The Annapolis Regional Transportation Management Association (ARTMA), in cooperation with Anne Arundel County (AAC) and the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA), manages a comprehensive ridesharing program for the residents of Anne Arundel County. The mission is to promote transportation options and transit expansion throughout Anne Arundel County by increasing mobility, thus reducing traffic congestion, as well as improving air quality. The service areas include Annapolis, Parole, Odenton, Severna Park, Crofton, Crownsville and the entire region of the County south of Annapolis.

In order to meet the demands for commuter transportation programs and services due to the increasing residential and commercial development in the County, both ARTMA and Anne Arundel County work in unison in an attempt to secure increased shares of Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program (CMAQ) funding.

Another portion of the County's CMAQ funds is allocated to the Baltimore Washington International Business Partnership (BWIP). This organization promotes ridesharing, car pooling, and point-to-point van service in and around BWI-Thurgood Marshall Airport.

Airports

BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport

BWI is located in Linthicum, approximately 10 miles south of Baltimore and 30 miles north of Washington. The airport is owned by the State and operated by the Maryland Aviation Administration (MAA). It is the largest airport in the State and serves the general public

carrying over 21 million passengers in 2007. It has four runways, the longest being approximately 10,500 feet and has 79 based general aviation aircraft. Southwest Airlines is the airport's largest carrier, accounting for over 50% of passengers using the airport in 2007. Its central location between Baltimore and Washington and proximity to Fort Meade and NSA have helped make it one of the biggest economic engines in Maryland, serving government, the federal technical and hospitality industries.



BWI Terminal Road Improvements

Tipton Airport

Transferred by Fort Meade to the County as a result of an earlier BRAC recommendation, Tipton Airport opened in 1999 and is located just south of Ft. George G. Meade. The Tipton Airport Authority operates the facility and is appointed by the County Executive. The airport primarily



serves the general aviation community with its one 3,000 foot X 75 foot runway. Over one hundred aircraft are based at the facility that has an average of approximately 150 aircraft operations a day. The airport has a signed environmental assessment permitting it to extend its runway to 4,000 feet, thus permitting operations by larger turboprop aircraft, but not commercial jet aircraft. Also included in the Environmental Assessment/Finding of No Significant Impact is permission to construct more hangar space.

Lee Airport

Lee Airport is a privately owned general aviation airport located on MD 2 south of Annapolis. It has a 2,500 X 48 foot runway. Nearly 100 aircraft are based at the facility that averages about 90 operations a day.



Pedestrian and Bicycle Network


In 2003, the County Council adopted the *Anne Arundel County Pedestrian and Bicycle Master Plan* (Bill 2-03, March 24, 2003). The Plan acknowledges that over 40 percent of person-trips are less than 2 miles. By developing a network of pedestrian and bicycle facilities, other options for travel become possible. The Plan identified economic benefits, transportation benefits, environmental benefits, recreation/health benefits and quality of life benefits. The Plan recommended integrating bicycle/pedestrian facilities into the roadway design process, enhancing the existing trails network, integrating pedestrian/bicycle facilities into the development review process, promoting bicycle safety through education of both adults and children and creating an organizational structure to implement bicycle and pedestrian programs and projects. The Plan also serves to further the relationship among other plans such as the Greenways Master Plan, the adopted Small Area Plans, the City of Annapolis Take-A-Step Map, the Maryland Statewide Greenway Atlas and the Maryland Statewide Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan.

While several of these recommendations are ongoing through capital projects and development proposal reviews, the identification of a single source agency for program, project and plan implementation has not occurred.

The Plan identifies corridors for pedestrian/bicycle facility location and areas where pedestrian activity should be supported through the construction of necessary facilities such as sidewalks, street lighting, pedestrian ramps and crosswalks, etc. The Office of Planning and Zoning, through its Transportation Facilities Planning program (included in the Capital Improvements Program) is conducting design studies to identify pedestrian/bicycle facilities along the most important (Tier I) corridors and within the Pedestrian Activity Centers. A map displaying the Plan's recommendations is included as Figure 1.

Current bicycling conditions reflect approximately 30 miles of existing multi-use trails including Baltimore and Annapolis Trail, BWI Trail Park, Chesapeake Beach Rail Trail, South Shore Trail, Poplar Trail, and Annapolis Colonial Maritime Trail. The West County WB&A Trail is adding segments. However, opportunities for on-road bicycling are at best, poor, due to lack of striped lanes, designated bicycle routes, funding, rights-of-way and logical connections between desired origins and destinations. In addition, poor terrain, topography and street and draining infrastructure conditions, high-speed traffic flow, and scenic and historic road designations limit opportunities.

Current pedestrian conditions reflect inconsistent treatment of facility needs across the County. Small Area Plans and other opportunities to collect input from pedestrians have indicated that there are a lack of pedestrian links between neighborhood and other activity centers, of sidewalks



and street furniture/landscaping and other pedestrian amenities along public roads, and of crosswalks, signs and pedestrian signals at intersections.

Highway Network

The transportation goal of the GDP emphasizes the need to sustain existing and future mobility, and to provide appropriate access for Anne Arundel County residents and those who work in the

County. The complementary networks of roads, rail and bus transit, and trail facilities for pedestrians and bikers that make up the county's transportation system interact differently. The primary mode of travel used by residents and businesses in the County is the automobile. Therefore, the highway network is the predominant travel purveyor and will continue in that role well into the anticipated span of the 2008 GDP.

Anne Arundel County is a suburban jurisdiction with auto-oriented activity centers, an abundance of free and surface parking and high automobile ownership. There



are more than 500,000 vehicles registered in Anne Arundel County and they are driven on approximately 4,850 lane miles of roads that are maintained by the National Park Service, the Maryland State Highway Administration (SHA), the City of Annapolis, the Maryland Transportation Authority (MdTA), and the Anne Arundel County Department of Public Works (AADPW).

Highway Network County and State Transportation Projects

Transportation projects planned, designed and constructed within the County typically are provided by land developers through a permit process, as a capital project by the AADPW, or as a project by the SHA. Some of these projects propose long-range transportation improvements for existing roadways and may involve new transportation and transit routes. The AADPW maintains a list of projects and their current status on their website. The SHA, the MdTA and the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) maintain a list of major projects on the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) website. The status of several projects is noted in Table 7 in Section III of this report.

Functional Classification Map

The Functional Classification Map identifies current and future highway and transit proposals throughout the County. The map also identifies roadways by their functional classification, which is the grouping of highways, roads and streets by the character of service they provide. These classifications reflect the utility of the various facilities and should determine the design of the roadway. In Anne Arundel County, roadway facilities are classified as Freeways, Principal Arterials, Minor Arterials, Collectors and Local Roadways.

All roads serve the dual functions of providing mobility and access. Mobility and access are inversely related as more mobility (measured in speed and capacity) means less access (measured in numbers of driveways and intersections over a distance). Arterials are primarily for moving vehicles from one place to another. They may still provide access to some adjacent lands, but accesses should be kept to a minimum in order to maintain a high level of service in

terms of mobility. Local roads, on the other end of the scale, are primarily oriented toward providing access to adjacent land. While they do serve to provide some degree of mobility from one location to another, they are not generally designed to process the volume and speed of traffic one would expect to find on a principal arterial.

• Freeway

Freeways are high speed, multi-lane facilities with a high degree of access control. These facilities provide for efficient and uninterrupted travel over long distances serving interstate and commuter needs. They should provide a high level of traffic service for travelers making longer distance trips at high speeds. Freeways provide no direct access to abutting properties.

• Principal Arterial

Principal Arterials serve the needs of through traffic for moderately long trips. They serve the major activity centers in the County and major portions of the trips entering or leaving urban areas. Principal Arterials are the primary travel route for commercial, commuter and recreational travel in rural areas. They also provide secondary linkages between large urban centers and suburban population/employment centers. Access may be controlled through medians or by the limitation of curb cuts through the orientation of access for new developments. Typically, they intersect minor arterials, collector or major activity locations.

Minor Arterial

Minor Arterials connect higher functional class facilities, activity centers, regions of the area, and major county roads. Traffic is composed predominantly of trips across and within regions of the city. They provide service to traffic at a somewhat lower level of travel mobility than principal arterials with minimal control of access to abutting commercial, industrial and residential properties. Direct access to individual properties and neighborhoods is discouraged.


Collectors

Collectors provide traffic circulation within neighborhoods, commercial and industrial areas. These roads collect traffic from local streets in neighborhoods and channel it into the arterial system. Connections between arterials should be indirect or should not be allowed in order to discourage use by traffic from outside the neighborhood.

Local Roads

Local roads are designed specifically to have high accessibility to abutting land and access to the higher classification facilities. They offer the lowest level of mobility and service to through traffic usually is deliberately discouraged.

The Functional Classification Map is shown in Figure 2 and reflects the assumed classification of roadway links in the major highway network and changes since the adoption of the 1997 Functional Classification Map. Appendix A lists the Road Functional Classifications for all road segments on the Functional Classification Map.



Level of Service

Roadway networks are evaluated by comparing the traffic volumes along each facility to the facility's capacity. Roadway capacity is defined as the ability to accommodate traffic. Service flow volume is the level of traffic flow (vehicles per day) that can be accommodated at various levels of service. On roads other than freeways, Levels of Service (LOS) are determined by measuring or calculating the average delay time for vehicles traveling along a roadway or through intersections. Delay can be caused by a variety of conditions, such as traffic control devices (stop signs and traffic signals), yielding to opposing through traffic, parking maneuvers adjacent to travel lanes and, at times, high volumes of traffic. Short delays are indicative of very good travel conditions, while very long delays generally reflect conditions considered to be unacceptable to most drivers. In the peak demand times, traditionally more delay occurs. As the daily service volume increases the duration of the peak demand period also increases.

The Level of Service Map identifies the level of service along the roadway network in Anne Arundel County as a qualitative description of roadway operations ranging from LOS A (free flow conditions) to LOS F (completely jammed conditions). In urbanized areas such as northern and eastern portions of the County, signal density (number of signals per center line mile of highway) dictates travel flow and delay. Typically signal density of less than one per two-mile segment frames the amount of delay. In less urban areas, where the roadways are controlled by devices (typically STOP and YIELD signs) on the minor street approach, these and the geometry of the roadway (lane width, available shoulder width, terrain and typography) are the features which dictate the capacity of the road.

Levels of Service A, B, C and D are generally representative of delay times acceptable to most drivers under typical travel conditions. Levels of Service E and F reflect the higher delay time ranges and can be regarded as approximations of the limits of acceptable delay, especially if found to occur over long periods of time. Once capacity is reached along a roadway or at an intersection and travel demand continues to increase the duration of the congestion (length of time when the intersection or location operates at an unacceptable level of service) lengthens. This occurrence is typical in more urbanized areas and less tolerable in suburbanized areas.

A Level of Service Map (Figure 3) and Table (Table 4) are provided based on observed travel demand for 2005 and network capacities during that year.



Travel Forecast 2035

Analyses of travel demand model output which contained quantitative data and statistical measures were conducted to provide an understanding of how much traffic will utilize the roadways in Anne Arundel County for the year 2035 based on the County's goals and policies. In order to show the increase in travel demand, the model has been run for 2005 (a calibration year) and for the future year 2035.

Numerical data collected to quantify traffic in Anne Arundel County for the year 2035 came from the Baltimore Region Travel Demand Model. The travel demand model utilized data from 2005 and was validated against present day conditions. Data from the Round 7 cooperative socioeconomic forecasts were used to generate the trips in the model and are distributed throughout the region and then assigned to roadway segments. There are more than 19,000 one-way links or roadway segments in the model. Performance measures have been developed to analyze simulation characteristics to show travel demand results.

The travel model consists of over 1,500 transportation analysis zones (TAZ) that contain land use and demographic data (employment, household size, population, income by household, auto ownership, etc.). The universe of this model extends from the Susquehanna River in the north to the Potomac River in the south, from the William Preston Lane Chesapeake Bay Bridge to the east to Carroll County to the west. The forecast change in population, households and employment between 2005 and 2035 is displayed in Table 5 below.

The implication of substantial increases in employment over the 30 year horizon coupled with a more modest increase in population and households implies that there will be far more jobs than households, leading to either greater amounts of automobile ownership per household or greater dependence upon transit to provide the connection between the home and the job.

Figure 4 and Table 6 present the 2035 Level of Service reflecting the forecast travel demand in that year based on changes in population, employment and the road network.



III. Long Range Plan

The generation, distribution and assignment of the travel demand model results in the forecast need to construct additional capacity on several roadway links within the County. Over two-thirds of those links are maintained by the State of Maryland, which reflects County driving behavior favoring the higher classification (speed and capacity) roadways. Nearly 70 percent of the County's total travel demand is found on those 1,200 lane miles of roadways owned by the State of Maryland. Given the output of the travel demand model (trips) several of those facilities will require upgrades to meet anticipated travel demand by 2035.

The Long Range Plan (LRP) is a planning document developed to meet Federal requirements allowing the use of Federal funds to plan, design and construct transportation infrastructure including fixed guideway transit (light, heavy and commuter rail), highways, and bridges. Both the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1991 and the most recent Transportation Reauthorization Act or SAFETEA-LU (PL 109-59) require that Long Range Plans adopted by Metropolitan Planning Organizations must be constrained by the financial capacities of the Federal, State and local sources of transportation funds, result in improvements to the region's air quality and conform to other Federal requirements protecting the natural and built environment. For air quality purposes and systems planning, the County is included in the Baltimore Region. The Baltimore Metropolitan Commission's current Long Range Plan is *Transportation Outlook 2035*.

Based on the growth in travel demand in the County and throughout the region, Anne Arundel County has identified several projects for construction over the 30-year time span between 2005 and 2035. Projects on major highway facilities are identified through analysis and programmed for construction through three stages in State methods:

- Consolidated Transportation Program (CTP) which is the State of Maryland's capital budget document identifying all funds to be expended (Federal, State, local and other) on State-owned facilities. The document has a six-year horizon.
- The Long Range Plan (LRP) which identifies projects arrayed over a longer span of time and although funds are not presently identified for all phases of project development (planning, design, right-of-way acquisition and construction), there is a reasonable assumption that these activities will occur over the 30 year span.
- The Highway Needs Inventory (HNI) which is limited to highway facilities for which there is an assumed need to plan, design and construct improvements over a longer span of time beyond known funding.

Under the present process, projects in Maryland requiring Federal funds or needing Federal permits (water quality, dredging/fill, etc), classified as an arterial or higher, and that are greater than one mile in length are typically noted in the HNI, moved into the LRP as funding becomes reasonable to assume, and finally identified in the CTP when funding becomes available.

In addition to the State process, Anne Arundel County has funded State facilities either in total or in part using impact fees, general obligation bonds, taxing districts and other forms of revenue generation. Those projects appear in the County's Capital Improvements Program (CIP).

Projects in Anne Arundel County that are currently funded and are included in the Long Range Plan or Highway Needs Inventory are listed in Table 7 below.

^{*}Please note that the term "managed lanes" assumes some type of control of use will be placed upon them such as high occupancy vehicles (HOV) only, Express-Toll-Lanes (ETL) or variable pricing. Instances where these lanes are identified are done so with the understanding that there will be no more add lane options in these corridors.

Highway Network Completions and Priorities

The present highway network in Anne Arundel County is composed of over 4,800 lane miles of roadways. Approximately 1,200 lane miles of that network are maintained by agencies of the MDOT, mostly the SHA and the MdTA, which predominately maintains the William Preston Lane (Chesapeake Bay) Bridge. The Federal Lands Division of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) maintains a portion of the network known as the Baltimore-Washington Parkway (BWP). In addition to being a highway, the BWP is identified as a cultural resource and parkland. These distinctions limit the facility's ability to be widened or to construct additional points of access.

As mentioned above, roadway and capacity construction within the County is accomplished by several means. Projects included in the CTP have been previously identified in the County's Annual Construction Priorities Letter sent by the County Executive to the Maryland Secretary of Transportation. By State code, the Secretary considers all requests, but is more compelled to respond to requests on the secondary network, which includes roads below the freeway or

principal arterial classification. Projects in the CTP (if Federal funds are included) must be included in the Baltimore Metropolitan Region's Long Range Plan. To be included in this Plan the project must have been reviewed for and found to be supportive of Federal requirements to improve the air quality of the region based on requirements established under the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990. Finally, projects that the State has identified in the Highway Needs Inventory (HNI) document are afforded a much greater possibility of being funded for construction.

The following are among the highway projects of note that have been completed since 1997:

- MD 2/US 50-301 Interchange improvements which provide redundancy and more options for motorists in the Parole area as well as better connections to Anne Arundel Medical Center, Westfield Shopping Center in Annapolis (Annapolis Mall) and other locations north of US 50 near MD 2.
- MD 32 interchanges at the National Security Agency at Fort Meade, removing the last two traffic signals along MD 32 between I-97 and Columbia in Howard County.
- Arundel Mills Boulevard interchange with MD 295 (Baltimore Washington Parkway), providing direct access to the large commercial and residential regional activity area at Arundel Mills.
- MD 100, providing a continuous four-lane freeway facility between Columbia in Howard County and Pasadena, with improved access to BWI-Thurgood Marshall Airport.
- East-West Boulevard, providing a continuous two to four-lane minor arterial access between Veterans' Highway (MD 178) and Governor Ritchie Highway (MD 2), north of Benfield Boulevard and the Severn River.
- MD 177 (Mountain Road) between Woods Road and Maryland Avenue, providing a reversible lane in the center lane; during peak hours the lane controls switch the lane flow to the peak direction; in off-peak hours, the lane reverts to a center turn lane.

Priorities for completion over the planning horizon of the 2008 GDP will include roadways carrying a greater travel demand than supply (capacity) supports. Most of those roadway segments are identified in Table 7 above, and either the SHA or the MdTA maintains virtually all of these segments. If an improvement is not financed by a developer meeting APF requirements, then the County must either wait for Federal and/or State actions to occur or must use local funds (impact fees, impact bonds, general obligation bonds, general revenue paygo) to finance improvements.

Transit Network Completions and Priorities

Anne Arundel County is served by multiple forms of transit, being situated between Baltimore and Washington, along the Northeast Corridor and containing the BWI-Thurgood Marshall Airport. Among those are AMTRAK (BWI Station), two MARC Commuter rail lines (Penn Line and Camden-CSX line) serving BWI, Odenton, and Jessup, and the Baltimore Central Light Rail Line (Yellow Line) serving BWI, Cromwell, and Linthicum. With the exception of the

double-tracking of the Light Rail Transit line previously mentioned, and the current fixed route bus service as noted below, there have been few completions of transit projects in the County since the adoption of the 1997 GDP.

Bus Transit Service

In addition to the fixed rail services noted above, the County is served by approximately 20 bus fixed routes operated by Maryland Transit Administration (MTA), City of Annapolis (AT), Corridor Transportation Corporation (CTC) and very recently Dillon Bus Service. Beyond fixed route transit, the Department of Aging and Disabilities (DoAD) operates a specialized demand-

response service throughout the County for qualifying residents. Additionally, two bus routes are operated by the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) under contract to MTA serving BWI-Thurgood Marshall connecting to the Greenbelt Metrorail Station on the Green Line and also serving Crofton connecting to the New Carrollton Metrorail Station on the Orange Line. Both of the WMATA services are limited contractually to serve specific places and do not open doors to carry passengers from other locations.


Since the adoption of the 1997 GDP, the County prepared a Transit Development Plan (TDP), which identifies priorities for bus transit improvements and strives to better coordinate existing services. The highest route priorities for bus transit in the 2003 TDP are:

- West County service bundle including connections to Fort Meade, Severn, Odenton, Crofton and Laurel,
- North and East County service bundle including connections to Pasadena, Lake Shore, Glen Burnie, and Riviera Beach.
- Edgewater, Annapolis, Parole, and Arnold connections, and
- South County service bundle including connections to Waysons, Deale, and Shady Side from Annapolis.




Figure 5 Transit Development Plan

Approximate service areas and routes of these bus transit bundles are displayed in Figure 5.

Central Maryland Transit Operations Facility

The highest capital priority to support the expansion of community based transit services in the County includes the construction of a Transit Operations Facility, commonly referred to as the Central Maryland Transit Operations Facility (CMTOF). Its purpose is to provide a centralized garage for transit services in portions of the County, Howard County and the City of Laurel in Prince George's County. Ownership of a facility will help to increase opportunities for competition among operating contractors as the jurisdictions contract for operators, mechanics, route supervisors and other forms of labor necessary to deliver transit services. Without a facility, only contractors owning or having access to a garage can bid to provide the services. Few operators have facilities and therefore competition among potential contractors is limited.




Piney Orchard/ Laurel




Deale/ Tracys Landing Waysons Corner Route Edgewater/ Mayo




Parole Circulator

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Limited competition generally pulls up the cost of providing service. Higher cost for service leads to fewer hours of service, more expansive fares for riders, or greater public expenditures for the same amount of service.

Bus Vehicle Ownership

The other capital component to transit is ownership of the vehicles. A high priority is to purchase transit buses to operate the routes noted above. In order to fully operate the service bundles noted above, the County will need to acquire approximately 30 vehicles which include both buses to run the routes and spare vehicles to replace them, as needed. This does not include the current DoAD paratransit operation which currently owns 39 vehicles that generally do not have the capacity or are not designed to support fixed route, frequent stops, and longer distance operations.

Yellow Line Extension

The priority for LRT in the County is a formalized planning start, meeting necessary Federal Transit Administration, National Environmental Policy Act and New Starts (Section 5309)




requirements, to extend the Yellow Line from its present terminus at the BWI Business Park station to the Dorsey MARC station in Howard County. Previously studied in the Baltimore Regional Rail Plan, the Yellow Line extension, studied by the County in 2003 would provide a direct and higher quality transit connection between BWI, Arundel Mills, and Dorsey MARC. It could also provide a rail bridge between the Penn Line MARC at BWI Station and the Camden-CSX MARC at Dorsey Station. A map of the study corridor is provided in Figure 6.

MTA Light Rail

MARC Capacity and Accessibility

The priority for MARC is increasing capacity and accessibility to the system for residents and businesses in the County. Presently MARC Penn Line service to BWI and to Odenton is on par with services offered to communities and activity centers elsewhere in the Northeast Corridor. Capacity increases to the MARC system will come from increasing the span of service (weekend trains, a longer service day adding earlier and later trains) and the capacity per train by adding more bi-level rail cars which increase the per-train capacity by as much as 60 percent. Accessibility to the MARC is primarily by automobile. Parking at the Odenton MARC station is very fragmented and land intensive. Use of the land for surface parking reduces the viability of redeveloping the area into the transit oriented community envisioned in the Odenton Town Center Master Plan and other land development guiding documents in the County. Further, the land side or parking support will not meet anticipated future demand for MARC service from Odenton to Washington, BWI or Baltimore. As MTA implements service improvements to MARC in the Northeast Corridor, additional parking at the station is warranted. Additional surface parking will continue to underutilize land around the station. MARC anticipates growing the ridership using this station from 2,100 daily boardings to approximately 3,100 daily boardings.

Priority Transit Corridor Studies

Patterns of travel demand, growth in employment, and wages paid by that employment should dictate where improvements to the quality and quantity of transit should be provided. Growth in employment in and around Washington DC and its suburban Maryland and Virginia jurisdictions should continue to draw commuter trips to these areas. The other wellspring of employment should be the area around Fort Meade, BWI-Thurgood Marshall and the I-95 Corridor (including Columbia) in Howard County.

All three of these employment activity centers are connected to major residential areas by a freeway system (US 50-301, I-97, MD 100, MD 32). By making a few route changes from these roads to connect to Annapolis, Parole, Odenton and other residential areas or park and ride facilities, these roadways could become the skeleton of an improved bus or bus rapid transit network.

Improving the quality of transit services in these corridors will require construction of land side appurtenances. Among these are park and ride facilities, passenger amenities such as sheltered platforms, off-vehicle fare collection, and common fare media to permit simple transfers among

operators. Construction of intermodal centers located at major County employment centers is also a necessary step to identify capital investment in quality bus transit.

Highway improvements permitting exclusive transit lanes, queue jumper lanes around at-grade intersections, and signal prioritization to allow transit vehicles to maintain schedules are all necessary features to improve the quality of the service.

Regional Rail Transit Priorities for Study

Located between Baltimore and Washington and having access to the Northeast Corridor, Anne Arundel County is situated in an area that should be served by higher quality transit. Presently, the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) is considering various modes of fixed guideway rail transit including MagLev (magnetic levitation), extension of the WMATA Green Line from Greenbelt (E Route) and improvements to service on the Penn Line of the MARC system. Given the significant cost of implementing any of these three rail transit improvements, it is highly doubtful that all three would be constructed within the life of this plan or for decades thereafter.

While location of the alignment and access stations to any of these three rail system choices is ultimately a decision based on environmental impacts, capital and operating costs, and benefits, decisions regarding land use and modes of access to the stations are within the purview of the County. Identifying alignments goes beyond the scope of the GDP, but noting activity centers that should be served is appropriate. Regardless of selected mode, service connecting Fort Meade/NSA, MD 32, MD 100, and BWI should be assumed for any mode alternative and alignment.

IV. Conclusions

Anticipated growth in households, population and employment will lead to greater travel demand generated within the County. Currently, the County's road network experiences 4.2 billion vehicle miles of travel (VMT) annually (2006 latest data available). On a per capita basis the fourth highest VMT coupled with the fourth highest total population yields the highest VMT per capita in the State of Maryland.

The County experiences this high rate of travel demand due to the number of significant regional and State facilities located in the County, the geographic location between the Nation's Capital and Baltimore, and its large number of peninsulas. Since the County is also the location for several of the state's most important facilities such as the William Preston Lane (Chesapeake Bay) Bridge, Maryland's Port of Baltimore, BWI-Thurgood Marshall Airport, Fort George G. Meade, and the State Capital in the City of Annapolis, much travel occurs in and through the County which is independent of the County's demographic changes and land use configuration. The County's location between the Baltimore and Washington Metropolitan Areas also is conducive to through travel, again separate from communities and employment areas of the County. Further adding to this situation is the physical geography of the County with its peninsulas where every trip into the peninsula requires a trip off of the same land mass. Finally, the County's many rivers and associated wetlands combine to channel that travel demand into a few corridors. All of these features, coupled with the anticipated growth in population and employment will lead to still greater demand for these facilities.

These geographic and locational issues place additional stress on the County's transportation network. Highway or transit improvements constructed to support the anticipated increase in travel demand are available at high cost, and frequently only through Federal and/or State participation in both the planning and construction process. While the County can and does choose to participate in the planning and funding process, it is frequently unable to advance high priority projects that are subject to Federal and/or State action.

Funding for transportation facilities will likely have to compete with other County (and State) budget priorities. Even within funding sources dedicated to transportation, competition between system preservation (greater than 60 percent of the current State transportation budget) and system expansion (closer to 20 percent of the State transportation budget) will become even sharper over the GDP planning horizon. Much of the capacity expansion within the County happened during the 1970s through 1990s. Over the span of this plan those facilities will need substantial renovations and preservation, thus making simple expansion difficult to accomplish.

Therefore, it is very likely that the County will need to bear a greater financial burden on not only taking care of its own facilities, but also shouldering the cost to expand State owned transportation infrastructure. Other than impact fees, which can only be used to fund capacity improvements, not preservation, the County does not have a dedicated source of revenue to use for that purpose. This situation will also lead to greater competition among needs for available general revenue and bond funding for capital projects.

While a greater shift to use of transit is likely to occur assuming that funding is made available for operating and capital expenses related to transit, a change from one mode to another is a long process, especially in terms of transportation investments made by families and businesses, changing land use patterns and site design and the quality and quantity of transit supply made available.

To meet the challenges noted in the travel demand forecast, the County will need to consider taking measures to increase its funding for both the maintenance and the expansion of transportation facilities both in terms of highway improvements, pedestrian/bicycle facilities and transit service. It will also need to consider focusing the transportation program in a fashion similar to other public services where the service is provided under "one roof" rather than diffused among several staff agencies. The County will need to consider the impact of development on a larger segment of the transportation network, not merely the point of access, but also points where the network intersects with other segments. Finally, it will need to consider the outcome of land use patterns and site design as they relate to transportation services and demand, as the County continues to develop and revitalize.
