20	(E) No refund of excess contributions. IF A PARTICIPANT TRANSFERS FROM A

22	PENSIONS ARTICLE OF THE STATE CODE, ALL ACCUMULATED CONTRIBUTIONS IN THE
23	PREVIOUS CONTRIBUTORY PLAN SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT PLAN. ANY AMOUNT OF ACCUMULATED CONTRIBUTIONS IN EXCESS OF THE
