## A BILL ENTITLED

1	AN ORDINANCE concerning: Floodplain Management, Erosion and Sediment Control
2	and Stormwater Management – Civil Fines
3	
4	FOR the purpose of allowing for the assessment of civil fines for certain erosion and
5	sediment control violations outside of the critical area; and generally relating to
6	floodplain management, erosion and sediment control, and stormwater management.
7	
8	BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments: § 16-5-105
9	Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended)
10	
11	SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland,
12	That Section(s) of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended) read as follows:
13	
14	ARTICLE 16. FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT, EROSION AND SEDIMENT
15	CONTROL, AND STORMWATER MANAGEMENT
16	
17	TITLE 5. VIOLATIONS, ENFORCEMENT, AND PENALTIES
18	
19	16-5-105. Civil fines.
20	
21	(a) Generally. A violation of any provision of this article is a civil offense, punishable
22	by a civil fine as provided by § 9-2-101 of this Code.
23	
24	(b) Critical area violations.

1	(1) Erosion and sediment control violations. It is a Class A civil offense to violate
2	any provision of Title 3 in the critical area.
3	
4	(2) Stormwater management violations. It is a Class A civil offense to violate
5	any provision of Title 4 in the critical area.
6	
7	(3) Other critical area violations. Except as otherwise provided by this section, it
8	is a Class A civil offense to violate any provision of Article 17, Title 8.
9	
10	(4) Factors in assessing fines. The following factors shall be considered in
11	determining the amount of any fine assessed under this section for violations in the critical
12	area:
13	
14	(i) the gravity of the violation;
15	
16	(ii) any willfulness or negligence involved in the violation;

18	(iii) the environmental impact of the violation; and

20	(iv) the cost of restoration and mitigation, including any cost incurred by the
21	State or County.

23	(c) Violations outside the critical area.
24	
25	(1) Erosion and sediment control violations. IT IS A CLASS A CIVIL OFFENSE TO
26	VIOLATE ANY PROVISION OF TITLE 3 OUTSIDE THE CRITICAL AREA. THE FACTORS LISTED
27	IN SUBSECTION (B)(4) SHALL BE CONSIDERED IN DETERMINING THE AMOUNT OF THE FINE
28	ASSESSED.

30	(2) Stormwater management violations. It is a Class B civil offense to violate any
31 32	provision of Title 4 [of this article] outside the critical area.
33	(d) Other violations. It is a Class C civil offense to violete any other working. Cities
34	(d) <b>Other violations.</b> It is a Class C civil offense to violate any other provision of this article.
