THE COUNTY ATTORNEY SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE AND CONFIRMED BY RESOLUTION OF THE COUNTY COUNCIL. The Office of Law shall be administered by the County Attorney. The County Attorney shall be a resident of the County and a member in good standing of the Bar of the Court of Appeals and of the Circuit Court for Anne Arundel County, and shall have been actively engaged in the general practice of his profession in the State of Maryland for at least five years prior to appointment. The County Attorney shall serve on a full-time basis and shall not engage in the private practice of law while County Attorney.
