Re: Saving My Life

To the Annapolis Paramedic Team(s):

I do not want to be overly dramatic, but I believe your top-notch Paramedic Team saved my life on Wednesday, July 14. I am a 73-year-old longtime resident of Annapolis who happens to be allergic to bee stings. Wednesday morning, I was doing some yard work along a fence in my back yard and stumbled into (quite literally) a hornet's nest! I was stung at least four times – on both hands and on my stomach. By the time I walked across the yard to my home, I was already feeling the effects – throat constriction, tongue enlarging, dizziness, sweating, nausea.

My wife, Priscilla, immediately gave me two Benadryl and we decided the safe thing to do was to drive me to the Emergency Room to have me checked out. But my condition rapidly worsened and there was no time, so we called 911. We later learned the ambulance was dispatched from the Bay Ridge station and joined by Engine 8 from the Annapolis Neck station. They arrived quickly but by that time my eyes were shut and I was having difficulty breathing. We were searching for my Epi-Pen, which undoubtedly was out of date, when they pulled into the driveway. We were later told the team was headed by Captain Monico and ably assisted by Lieutenant Lehmann. By the time it was all over, there we as many as six or seven people here to help administer drugs and perform other lifesaving actions before rolling me out to the ambulance. All of this was done quickly, smoothly and with amazing precision. I still couldn't open my eyes so I really never saw any of them, and only got some names by calling one of the stations the day after the event. These dedicated men and women were great and I am writing to give them, and all of you who do this work, my and my family's heartfelt thanks. I really do believe it saved my life because by the time they walked through my door I was sinking fast. Their work was fast, competent, compassionate, and explanatory. And it was all done with good humor. To get the stretcher into the house near me, they had to move a heavy chair and table out of the way. After I was loaded into the ambulance, a couple of the guys came back and kindly moved the furniture back in place. Not only that, they reinstalled a pin in the side storm door that was removed so the stretcher could be brought in. It was all greatly appreciated.

You may wish to know that I sent a copy of this letter to Annapolis Fire Chief Douglas Remaley so he knows of the great work that you do. Whatever you are paid, it is not enough. As one of the attendants in the ambulance said to me as I thanked him (and the others) for their work, "This is what we do. This is just a day at the office." A good day, I'd say. Again, our thanks for their amazing work.
