I wanted to express my appreciation to a crew who took care of and transported my father last week. The crew of Station 10 on August 27, 2020 which consisted of Engine 10- Lt. Joseph Holland, PO David Pennell, PM/FF Christopher Mekins and PM 10- PM Ashley Eckhardt, FF/EMT-B Joshua Schapiro.

Each member of the crew showed true professionalism and treated my father with the highest level of respect and dignity. The crew's compassion for my father, family and the situation was extraordinary and they all went above and beyond. This continued during the transport, triage and transfer of care of my father to the hospital with the crew of Medic 10. PM Ashley Eckhardt who also knows my father personally, maintained the highest level of professionalism and superior patient care to my father while calming and reassuring my father who was scared, nervous, anxious and feeling very ill.

She did everything she could to make him as comfortable as possible, talk him through every procedure and maintain his trust. She went above and beyond in every way possible for both my father and I. These actions of PM Eckhardt come as no surprise to me since she is a senior Paramedic in our department and operates in a preceptor role for new paramedics. It is truly awesome to see that she maintains high expectations for patient care and compassion.

FF/EMT-B Joshua Schapiro was no different, especially after finding out that this was only his second shift operating as a field clinician after finishing the fire academy and his Phase II training. He was professional, compassionate and respectful as mentioned above which was very much appreciated. His ability to establish and maintain a strong clinician/patient relationship as a new clinician himself was amazing. He was easily able to converse, calm and reassure my father. FF/EMT-B Schapiro also went above and beyond to care for and make my father as comfortable as possible during the call and while waiting for a bed at the hospital. He was able to figure out a common interest with my father (historic cars) and maintain conversation with him which diverted my father's attention to something positive.

As a member of the department as well as an instructor in EMS training, this experience made me extremely proud of the department that I am a part of. Especially during the trying times that we are currently operating in (COVID-

19). The extreme level of compassion and respect that was exhibited especially by a brand new member of our department was amazing. Dear Chief Wolford:

I want to express my sincerest thank you to the men and woman of the Anne Arundel Fire Department. Words cannot adequately express my, and my grandson Patrick's, gratitude and appreciation for the assistance given to us yesterday on our canoe trip on the Patuxent.

My grandson and I started a cance trip on the Patuxent from Governor Bridge planning to end at the Queen Anne landing. I have been canceing for 52 years. I had canced this stretch of the river twice before. We started at about 9 am. I did not expect to encounter the number of trees that were blocking passage going down the river. We portaged around 4 trees. We never capsized the cance but we did slip in the water several times trying to get around the trees. We past under the 214 bridge. I knew we were close to the Queen Anne landing but again encountered a fallen tree blocking our way. As we looked down the river, we could see 3 more trees that would need to be avoided. We were evidently close to Patuxent River Road. We could here the vehicles through the trees. I thought that if we could access the road, we could carry the cance and arrange to be picked up there. My grandson went to hike to the road. I did not want him to or expect for him to call 911 but he did when he flagged down a motorist to use their phone. One of our phones is in the river and the other was inoperable.

Your department immediately mobilized. I did not catch all the names but Assistant Fire Chief Shultz and maybe as many as 15 other personnel responded. Unbeknownst to me a friend independently called 911. Your dispatcher assured her that we were OK. Each and everyone was professional, caring and extremely helpful. The State Police helicopter responded. The personnel that had hiked into where I was by the river organized to carry out the canoe to the road. I know that there were Anne Arundel EMT's, personnel from Lothian and Riva Departments. I think there were other departments represented as well.

Please convey my heartfelt thanks to everyone. You must be extremely proud of the men and women who serve in the Anne Arundel Fire Department. Thank you.

Dear Chief Wolford,

Thursday night after going to bed I awoke around 2:30 a.m. I was covered in sweat and don't know if I woke up on my own or if my wife woke me. She attempted to get me to drink orange juice to no avail as I was pretty out of it with low sugar. My eyes were closed and I heard her voice in the distance saying she was calling 911. Next I recall is opening my eyes slightly, still covered in sweat, and 4 uniformed firefighters in my bedroom. I had only a pair of shorts on and the B-shift from the firehouse in Laurel, MD on 198 led by LT Hartlove tended to me. I recall them giving me a glucose concoction and drinking about 3 coffee cups of orange juice. They checked my sugar and it was 37. My wife said she was told they did not want to do an IV yet, but better with the glucose and orange juice to bring my sugar up and stabilize it some. All I wanted to do was sleep. Soon my sugar was at 167 and I seemed ok with that.

The condition I was in I know I just wanted to go to sleep. My mother asked the next day what I would do if my wife was not there. I stood in church today and announced to all she was a hero. Well, your B-Shift in Maryland City were heroic as well. Between them and my wife I think my life was saved. I will always believe your team led by Lt Hartlove likely saved me. They have my sincere appreciation. Thanks to you and their training for knowing what was needed. Please give them my thanks as well for their great work on my behalf.

I'd like to share a story one of our faculty just told me today. I want to convey how Captain Cvach helped save a young man's life through his teaching ability. We are thankful for his hard work and dedication.

Liz Westman's son conveyed some information to her that she wanted to share with us today. Her son's friend was in an accident on the capital beltway in June. He (the friend) is a mechanic by trade now but had taken Captain Cvach's EMR course (EMT104) when he was going to college at AACC. He stopped to help a woman on the side of the road with a flat tire. He parked in front of her. Apparently a pick-up truck stopped to see if they needed help and they stopped behind them on the beltway. Another car plowed into the pick-up truck and partially amputated this young man's leg. When the police officer arrived, he asked the kid what he could do to help. The kid apparently told him he needed his belt to apply a tourniquet and the police officer ran and got him the tourniquet and the kid self-applied. He credits Joe for teaching him how to do it right and saving his life. Thank you for being such a terrific instructor Joe Cvach!!
