# Introduced by Ms. Rodvien

## By the County Council, July 6, 2020

1	RESOLUTION encouraging the Board of Education for Anne Arundel County to better
2	support and fund the evolving mental health and transportation needs of all Anne Arundel
3	County Public School students

5	WHEREAS, as a result of the COVID-19 health pandemic, there has become an
6	increased need for mental health support for students in Anne Arundel County
7	Public Schools ("AACPS") as they grapple with extreme changes in daily routines
8	and family circumstances and with being separated from friends and extended
9	family; and

11	WHEREAS, increased mental health supports for AACPS students are also needed
12	to help young people within our school communities navigate the complex social
13	issues surrounding the killing of George Floyd and the Black Lives Matter
14	movement; and
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16	WHEREAS, the Board of Education for Anne Arundel County requested additional
17	mental health positions in its FY2021 budget to address the mental health needs of
18	AACPS students, the cost of which is approximately 0.06% of the total budget; and

20	WHEREAS, significant transportation needs also exist for AACPS students in the
21	current educational environment that are equally as important to the success and
22	development of all students; and
23	WHEREAC many arranging in large mosting many has maded to address the miles
24	WHEREAS, new expertise in bus routing may be needed to address changing
25	student attendance models as a result of the COVID-19 health pandemic; and
26 27	WHEREAS, during a June 30, 2020 briefing before the Education, Health, and
28	Environmental Affairs Committee of Maryland General Assembly, Dr. Karen B.
28 29	Salmon, State Superintendent of Schools, acknowledged that "transportation is one
30	of the most significant challenges we face" to reopening schools; and
31	of the most significant chancinges we face to reopening schools, and
32	WHEREAS, in 2019, a State Financial Management Practices Audit Report found
33	that, although AACPS owns an automated bus routing software tool, it has not fully
34	used this tool and instead continues to manually make modifications to routes,
35	thereby failing to establish comprehensive bus routing procedures and maximize
36	efficiency of its bus routes and address bus routes with low ridership; and

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WHEREAS, AACPS parents and students regularly report overcrowded buses with not enough seating, buses that do not show up or that drive past students waiting at their stops, and that sometimes result in students missing important instruction time, school breakfasts, and even entire days of school; and

WHEREAS, many AACPS families also report difficulties reaching the Transportation Division to discuss solutions to the problems with bus services and routes; and

WHEREAS, the well-being, safety, and attendance of all AACPS students depends on reliable, safe, and effective transportation to and from their schools; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, That it hereby encourages and strongly recommends that the Board of Education for Anne Arundel County fund the evolving mental health and transportation needs of Anne Arundel County Public School students without compromising either; and be it further
