1	RESOLUTION urging the County Executive to lift certain indoor restrictions imposed
2	on restaurants and bars in Anne Arundel County
3	
4	WHEREAS, on March 5, 2020, Maryland Governor Lawrence J. Hogan, Jr.
5	proclaimed a state of emergency and a catastrophic health emergency for the entire
6	State of Maryland pursuant to Title 14 of the Public Safety Article of the State
7	Code, due to the impending threat and continuing impact of the contagious disease
8	known as COVID-19; and
9	
10	WHEREAS, the Governor's proclamation has subsequently been renewed at
11	regular monthly intervals and is still in effect; and
12	
13	WHEREAS, by Executive Order No. 16 dated March 13, 2020, the Anne Arundel
14	County Executive proclaimed a civil emergency in Anne Arundel County, pursuant
15	to Article I, Title 6 of the Anne Arundel County Code (2005, as amended); and
16	
17	WHEREAS, by Bill No. 24-20, the County Council extended the Proclamation of
18	Civil Emergency by the County Executive through April 4, 2020, or to the date the
19	civil emergency proclamation for the State of Maryland is approved to be renewed,
20	extended, or terminated by the Governor of Maryland or the Maryland General
21	Assembly; and
22	WHEDEAC on Ivno 12, 2020, the County Everytive announced that Anno Anno del
23	WHEREAS, on June 12, 2020, the County Executive announced that Anne Arundel County would continue to Stage Two on the 'Maryland Strong: Roadmap to
24	Recovery'; and

27	WHEREAS, also on June 12, 2020, the State of Maryland began allowing food
28	service establishments to serve food and beverages to customers for consumption
29	in indoor seating areas at 50% capacity during regular business hours, but not in a
30	buffet format or to customers who are not seated; and
31	build format of to dustomers who are not seated, and
32	WHEREAS, on July 24, 2020, the County Executive issued Executive Order No.
33	27 that, among other things, requires restaurants, bars, and other similar
34	establishments that sell food and alcoholic beverages, or alcoholic beverages only,
35	for consumption on-premises in indoor dining facilities to cease all indoor service
36	at 10:00 p.m. daily; and

1 WHEREAS, on September 3, 2020, the County Executive announced that Anne Arundel County would continue at Stage Two on the 'Maryland Strong: Roadmap 2 3 to Recovery'; and 4 WHEREAS, since reopening at reduced capacity, restaurants and bars have 5 successfully implemented health and safety protocols that have kept patrons and 6 staff safe and, if allowed, could safely continue operations beyond 10:00 p.m. using 7 the same protocols; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the current current restriction imposed on restaurants and bars is 10 unduly burdensome and has created financial difficulties that compromise the 11 future of operations and these important County businesses; now, therefore, be it 12 13 Resolved by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, That it hereby 14 urges the County Executive to lift the operational restrictions imposed on restaurants, bars, 15 and other similar establishments by Executive Order No. 27 and allow these business to 16 operate past 10:00 p.m. daily with their current proper safety protocols in place; and be it 17 further 18 19 Resolved, That a copy of this Resolution be sent to County Executive Steuart Pittman. 20 AMENDMENTS ADOPTED: September 21, 2020
