What are the Results?

A trained facilitator gathers everyone that is affected by the conflict togive each participant achance to be heard.

Over 98% of those who reach an agreement are compliant with the agreement. Everyone gets to speak. People are held accountable for their behavior.

A Community Conference increases thechances of repairing the harm thathas been done. It is far less expensive than going through the legal system. It is a confidential process between the facilitator and theparticipants. Most of all it significantly decreases thechances the offender will become a 'repeat offender'.

→ What is a Community Conference?

A Community conference is a meeting of the community of people affected by behavior that has caused harm. The conference provides a forum in which offenders, victims, andtheir respective supporters can seek ways to repair damage caused by an incident and to minimize further harm.

Who Do We Help?

A conference gives those who have caused harm an opportunity to under- stand the impact of their behavior on other people, on themselves and on the wider community. A conference gives those affected an opportunity to explain how they feel and contribute to negotiations about how tomake things better.

How Do We Help?

Juveniles are held accountable for their harmful behavior. Through Community Conferencing we can help make sure the conflict gets resolved to everyone's satisfaction; most importantly, the victim.

COMMUNITY CONFERENCING IS A VOLUNTARY PROCESS

If participants reach an agreement, and do not comply, their case is returned to the Department of Juvenile Services, AACPS, or other referral source to be processed in the usual manner.

How it Works

- Each conference is led by a trained conference facilitator
- Conferences are held at a convenient time and location for participants - in person or online
- Everyone gets to tell how they have been impacted by the incident
- Those who have caused harm learn how others have been affected
- Everyone is part of the solution!
