


2022 Calls for Service

- > 847,493 Total Calls for Service
- ➢ 414,763 911 Emergency Calls
- ➢ 432,730 Non-Emergency Calls
- > 2,322 Calls Each Day (average)

2022 Community Engagement

- > 744 organized community events
- ➤ 5,279 hours at community events
- > 1,745 officers at community events.

2022 Central Records Activities

- > 249,380 officer reports processed
- 30,320 PIA/FOIA Requests (extrapolated based on 7 months data)
- ➤ 3,673 Expungement Orders

2022 Body Worn Camera Management

- ➤ 576,095 BWC recordings





Locker rooms undersized given the amount of assigned employees

Current Northern:

Inefficient and undersized for today operations

\$168 K





Patrol sergeant's office accommodates 4 desks, however the district has 9 patrol sergeants.

Undersized employee kitchen with no sink. Not ADA compliant

Lieutenant's office undersized and provides no space for private meetings with employees

Current Community Room insufficient for Warming Center needs.
