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WHEREAS, high intensity outpatient programs ("HIOP"), formerly known as partial hospitalization programs ("PHP"), are an increasingly common treatment modality for people struggling with substance use disorder to provide comprehensive medical and behavioral care in a hybrid outpatient setting; and

WHEREAS, individuals in HIOP do not receive treatment in a residential setting and many struggle to find appropriate residential housing to support their care; and

WHEREAS, a recovery residence is a facility that provides alcohol-free and illicit drug-free housing to individuals with substance-related disorders, and, when run safely and effectively, provides peer supported housing that is a critical bridge from early recovery to a healthy, stable, and engaged life in the community; and

WHEREAS, a lack of recovery residence standards can lead to the exploitation and victimization of individuals in recovery, and according to an article about recovery residences published May 18, 2018 in Governing magazine, "[t]here is rampant abuse of the system, including patient brokering, devious marketing practices, kickbacks from treatment providers, and insurance fraud."; and

WHEREAS, the County Council supports appropriate certification of recovery residences and other rehabilitation facilities by state and national agencies, including but not limited to certifications through Maryland Certification of Recovery Residences (MCORR), Maryland RecoveryNet (MDRN), the Maryland Behavioral Health Administration (BHA) and Local Behavioral Health Authorities (LBHA), and the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF), to ensure accountability and oversight to the highest professional standards; and

 WHEREAS, the County Council is committed to fostering collaboration between HIOP providers and recovery residences that promotes positive and supportive care for individuals with substance use disorder and that does not contribute to abuses in the substance use disorder treatment system which can negatively impact an individual's recovery; and

WHEREAS, the North Carolina General Assembly is considering the Stop Addiction Fraud Ethics Act of 2023 (House Bill 415) to help combat patient brokering and kickbacks in the substance use disorder treatment system by regulating the financial relationship between treatment providers and recovery residences; now, therefore, be it

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Resolved by the County Council of Anne Arundel County, Maryland, That it hereby urges the State of Maryland to enact new laws relating to truth in marketing and patient brokering and kickbacks for substance use disorder treatment providers and facilities; and be it further

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Resolved, That copies of this Resolution be sent to Delegate Heather Bagnall, Chair, Anne Arundel County House Delegation; and Senator Pamela G. Beidle, Chair, Anne Arundel County Senate Delegation.
